General

Curriculum Learning

Social Studies



This term we have a focus on **Social Studies**. P6 pupils are learning all about **China**, in particular, 'people, past events and societies'. Our exploration this term will centre on the rich and diverse history of the country. Children will engage in a variety of learning activities designed to deepen their understanding of China's cultural heritage. We will explore themes such as The Dynasties and The Terracotta Army and how they shaped Chinese history and society. We will examine key landmarks, historical and contemporary art, Chinese writing, language and Chinese New Year. [1st level Mandarin - BBC Bitesize](#). By engaging with these areas, we aim to enhance pupils' global awareness and encourage them, through inquiry, to draw connections between China and their own experiences here in Scotland.

Literacy



We have begun our class novel 'Journey to Jo'burg' <https://beverleynaidoo.com/journey-to-joburg/> and following on from last term in promoting **Learner Agency** in P6, the children have selected their own themes to write about a setting. For Reading and Comprehension, both classes have been highly engaged with the novel which has provided mature, rich discussions. It has also provided them with the opportunity to link their learning to the UNCRC rights of a child. The children continue to focus on transferring their handwriting skills across all areas of literacy and the curriculum.

Numeracy and Maths



The children are continuing to strengthen their **rapid recall** of both multiplication and division facts and how they are linked. This has allowed them to be successful in calculating 'inverse operations' and completing algebraic equations using the method line. Again, this knowledge has been essential in allowing the children to quickly identify factors and multiples. Through **Number Talks**, P6 will continue to develop their abilities in articulating their learning and use of maths processes to their peers, explaining which process was most effective for them.

Health and Wellbeing



This term, the children are working on the [NHSGGC - Your Body Matters Curriculum Pack \(P1-P7\)](#) which focuses on nutrition, physical activity, sustainability/food waste and body image, self esteem and the media. We are developing skills to identify the 5 components of the EatWell Guide in the foods and dishes that we eat. As well as this, we will consider composite dishes and the ways in which we can substitute certain food groups for healthier options. In PE, we are developing our skills in netball and athletics. We also look forward to learning some new skills in a taster block of Gaelic Football with a coach from [Tir Conaill Harps](#). In our Daily Mile we are continuing to focus on developing our stamina and perseverance. This includes ensuring we are focussing on our own achievements and challenging ourselves with our personal targets.

Religious Education



The children have been learning about the first gathering point within their Pope Francis Faith Award (PFFA), 'Knowledge'. As part of the award the children are invited to share their Gift at school, at home or in their church and share their experiences and reflections with the stage.
