Curriculum Learning

Social Studies



This term our focus in Primary 1 is **Scotland**, drawing on themes within **people, place and environment**. We have asked the children what they want to learn about to help create "Big Questions" for the topic. Each lesson focuses on addressing these Big Questions including geography, food, music, landmarks and famous people. Our Scotland topic will be taught by the Primary 1 Class teachers as well as Mrs Convery and Mrs Gould. We also celebrated Rabbin Burns Day in class and will use some Scottish poetry as our literacy focus as well.

We hope by the end of this topic to develop the children's understanding of the history, heritage and culture of Scotland. If you feel you would be able to contribute to our Scotland topic with a visit or resources (Scottish items/books) please contact us or get in touch via the school office.

Literacy



Building on the children's phonic knowledge in Term 1, we are now focussing on blending CVC and CCVC words. As well as this, the children have been introduced to **Digraphs** (a two letter spelling for a sound). There will be a new set of **Term 2 Common and Tricky** words sent home throughout the term which we would ask the children to continue to learn to read and write.

Our Drawing Club lessons have been met with great enthusiasm from our children with the majority of the year group creating and writing their own sentences! We would greatly encourage the children to practise **free-writing at home**.

We are continuing to explore fiction and non-fiction books as part of our reading programme. Each stage has a set of sight words. **Sight words** are words which do not follow a specific rule or pattern therefore our children are taught to identify them at a glance through repetition and word games which we continue to encourage as part of their homework.

Numeracy and Maths



In Numeracy, our main topics include [addition](#) and [subtraction](#). We are encouraging the children to have knowledge of the different language linked to both topics. Additionally, we are exploring a variety of approaches including using a number line, counting on and counting back. We are also exploring numbers 11-20 ([writing](#), [ordering](#), [missing number](#), [before, after and in-between](#)).

Primary 1 have been enjoying using Number Talks strategies and the Numeracy Blueprints to help improve their mental maths and problem solving approaches.

During our Maths time, we are using a variety of playful approaches to explore measuring length, capacity and weight, as well as, data analysis using tally marks and pictograms which we will also link to our Scotland topic.

Health and Wellbeing



Our P.E. focus this term is gymnastics and we know we have lots of children who attend gymnastics clubs! We are using our bodies to create different gymnastics shapes, jumps, rolls and sequences. We will continue to reflect on our Term 1 “Cool and School” strategies to help us make safe choices in the classroom and playground.

During our **food health** lessons, we are linking some of the learning to our Scotland topic including food tasting, making shortbread and learning about what food is produced in Scotland. We are also exploring the **Eatwell Guide**, identifying the different types of food that should be on our plate to achieve a healthy, balanced diet. **Your Body Matters** is another focus this term, that we are learning alongside the **Eatwell Guide**, how our body grows and what it needs to do this.

Religious Education



Primary 1 are confident with their school prayers as well as “The Hail Mary”. This Term we are focusing on **The Creation Story** followed by learning that of all of the days, Sunday is a special day as we attend Mass. We will explore how to participate respectfully during Mass followed by the beginning of **Lent** and the preparation for **Easter**.

Modern Languages



This term Primary 1 are going to be learning to recognise and name some food items in French. They will continue to learn how to talk about themselves in French, concentrating on saying, ‘My name is _.’ and ‘I am _ years old’.
