General

Curriculum Learning



This term we have a major focus in STEM. The children have been very engaged with their Science topics. These include food chains and food webs. We are investigating bees with the intention that we will invite beekeepers from St.Ninians to talk to us. We are currently studying forces, in particular floating and sinking. Your child should gain an understanding of buoyancy, density and shape and the impact these have on floating and sinking. We will then study magnetism, gravitational and electrostatic forces. We will also carry out a range of STEM engineering challenges, such as designing a hole for a crazy golf course and designing a foosball game.

In ICT we will be learning about AI and exploring the benefits and issues of using AI applications. A Parent's Guide to Introducing STEM at Home

In Reading we are focusing on asking and responding to questions about a text. We will be using a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts to support the development of our higher order thinking skills.

In Writing, we will be using the context of our STEM topic, Forces, to develop our note making skills. We will be promoting Learner Agency, allowing the children to choose which type of text they create with their notes, to demonstrate their learning.


Numeracy and Maths



Children have been focusing on rapid recall of the multiplication tables and how they link to division. We have been using Number Talks and the Numeracy Blueprints to focus on mental strategies for addition & subtraction. Numeracy and Mathematics | St Joseph's Primary School

Health and Wellbeing



In PE, we are developing our skills in rebound games, such as football, golf, basketball & hockey. In our Daily Mile we are focusing on developing our stamina and perseverance.



P5 will be celebrating their stage Mass on Tuesday 16th September. The children will reflect upon the up and coming school year, along with our school and Gospel values.

In our R.E. curriculum, we have been exploring Jesus' role as King, Prophet and Priest. This term, we will also be learning about Christian Imagery, looking at examples of carvings on Celtic crosses and Pictish stones and reflecting upon their strong links with the natural world. We will read from the Book of Genesis and we will study Psalm 148: the Canticle of Creation, giving thanks to God for the Mystery of Creation.



In French, we are continuing to develop our talking, listening, reading and writing skills. We are consolidating our knowledge of vocabulary associated with parts of the body through playing 'Simon Says' and listening to songs. We are learning to describe our own and others' eye colour, hair colour and hairstyles. Soon we hope to be able to play the 'Guess Who?' boardgame in French.
