# Photographer

# Uniform

I would like to take this opportunity to *thank you for supporting our Dressing for Excellence policy*. The children look very smart in their shirts and ties when you see them in and around the school. *Can I please remind parents/carers that all children are expected to change into plimsolls inside school. The plimsolls they have in their gym bag are fine for this use; we are trying to keep the new carpets looking nice.* 

School rule - Monday to Friday shirts and ties!!!

- **PE Kits** these are to be brought to school in a PE bag. Pupils should not wear their PE Kit to school.
- To date 207 pupils in the school have a school blazer that's just fewer than 60% of the pupils in the school. Your support is much appreciated.

#### Lunch Money

- Please ensure that if your child is paying for lunch that they have their money with them every day.
- Our cashless catering means pupils put their lunch and tuck money into the machine in the main hall on a daily basis.
- Please note that breakfast club pupils do not put their 95p in the machine. All cash for the breakfast club must be handed to Mrs. Muirhead.



# Lost Property/Labelling



Last session we had an incredible amount of lost property. This was due to the fact that shoes, trousers, jackets, jumpers, etc did not have any identifying name on them. Can I please encourage you to label your child's personal belongings including shoes and lunch bags.

P.E.

PE is a compulsory and important aspect of our curriculum. It is also a key vehicle by which the Scottish Government wishes to improve the health of Scottish children.

Your child should come to school with a full PE kit on their scheduled PE days. Their kit should be in line with school colours:

- Either an existing school polo shirt or plain white/yellow/red t-shirt
- Black shorts / jogging trousers
- Black / grey sweatshirt for outside
- Trainers/plimsolls
- Waterproof jacket for outdoors

East Renfrewshire's Parent Information Line is a free telephone information service concerning all matters relating to children's education. The service is available between 8am and 6pm, Monday to Friday and is also available in Urdu/Punjabi.

Parent Information Line is staffed by professionally trained personnel, who are able to provide information on a wide range of educational issues, e.g.: ideas to help with homework, advice on choosing a childminder and guidelines for using the internet safely with children. Enquiries can be made in confidence (unless a child is at risk and there is a child protection issue).

If the children wish to represent their class on one of our many pupil groups they must prepare a presentation and then be elected by their classmates. Being part of a committee requires pupils to attend monthly meetings and represent their class. They may also be asked to speak at assemblies and in front of their class. It is important that if children are nominated by their class that they show commitment and become actively involved in their committee. Pupil groups will meet on a monthly basis to discuss what their group will be involved in.

#### House System

As a way of promoting positive behaviour in St Mark's we have a house system. There are 4 houses - Mackintosh, Ogilvie, Bell and Wallace. The pupils in Primary 1 have now been allocated a house and will be given a badge which is their house colour. Pupils in Primary 1 who have older brothers and sisters in the school will be placed in the same house as them. Pupils are awarded house points for a variety of reasons including behaviour, manners and effort. Primary 7 pupils will prepare their campaigns for our forthcoming elections for our new House Captains and Vice Captains.

# Displays in the Hall – Information for Our New Parents/Carers Weekly Star Pupil



This wall display will be used to highlight an individual from each class who has shown hard work, determination, progress, etc over the week. These pupils will be give a star pupil certificate, badge and pencil at our Wednesday assembly.

# Head Teacher's Award

Each month one pupil from each class will be selected for the Head Teacher's Award. Each pupil's work will be displayed. At the Wednesday assembly each piece of work will be celebrated and pupils will receive a certificate and prize from the Head Teacher's Treasure chest!

# ACE Child Award

The purpose of ACE child is to recognise the high achievements of individual pupils who have become:

- Successful Learners
- Confident Individuals
- Effective Contributors
- Responsible Citizens
- Nominations for an ACE Child can be made by teachers, support staff, janitor, office staff, kitchen staff, etc.



This is a termly award. The winners of this award will be taken on a very special educational outing. Last session the children went tubing at Bellahouston Ski Centre.

## House Display



The pupils try to win points for their house. The points are updated on a weekly basis. At the end of the session the winning house receives the House Cup (which was donated by the Parent Council) and this is engraved with the winning House name. The pupils also receive a party in recognition of their hard work throughout the school year. Mackintosh won the House Cup for the last year - who will be the winner at by the end of 2015/16?

#### **Illegal Parking**

Can I please once again remind parents and carers dropping off and picking up children to be considerate when stopping and parking. Please DO NOT park over or in our neighbours' driveways particularly at the corner of Fenwick Drive.

Can I please remind parents that they should not drop off their children at the car park gates.



Please remind your child to be polite and respectful to our neighbours when entering and leaving the school.

#### **Breakfast** Club

Reminder - we have a breakfast club running in St. Mark's: <u>Time</u>: Starts at 8am. Last entry is at 8.45am <u>Entrance</u>: via the Hall door <u>Cost:</u> 95p per pupil

After the children have had their breakfast they can play games in the hall! No need to book a place.

#### **Consent Forms**

Pupils have been issued with local consent forms that will cover them for local trips within East Renfrewshire for session 2015-2016. If you have not already returned this please return ASAP; without this form your child will be unable to take part in trips within East Renfrewshire Area.

Consent forms will also be issued for trips outwith East Renfrewshire and for sporting activities throughout the year; **these must be signed and return or your child will be unable to attend**.

#### ICT Forms

Responsible User Agreement forms for the use of ICT equipment in the school will be sent out to all pupils. Could I please ask that parents/carers take time to read this important document? *Please sign and return this.* Thank you.

#### Photographs/DVD/Websites

We often take photographs of children to display in school or the school website. Occasionally, children feature in DVDs relating to school activities. *If you have any objection to your child's image being used then please let the office know in writing ASAP.* 

#### **Medical Checks**

The school nurse has asked me to remind parents/carers that only Pr. 7 pupils receive vision checks by the School Health Team. There is therefore a long gap since their last check in nursery and many pupils by Pr. 7 require glasses. Parents are therefore advised to take their child to a local optician periodically, to avoid delay in treatment where required.



# Safety in the Park

Our Primary 7 pupils took part last week in a series of workshops in Arthurlie House, Barrhead, based on keeping safe. A range of topics was covered; fire safety, strangers, alcohol and drug awareness and internet safety. This has become an annual event and is extremely worthwhile.

#### Manor Adventure

Can we remind parents that the cost of the residential trip to Manor Adventure is  $\pounds$ 140.00. The trip will take place from 30<sup>th</sup> November until Friday 4<sup>th</sup> December. Payments can be made each Friday in school or on the East Renfrewshire Payment website. Full payment should be made no later than Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November.

# Drop Off Zone/Sign In Area

The "Drop off Zone" is under the window at the school office. Can we ask that if your child has forgotten lunch bag, PE kit etc etc. that you leave it at the drop off zone with their name on it.

The area to sign into the school and sign your child out for appointments etc is now at main office reception window.

#### School Lunches

Last session there was a significant number of pupils who regularly came to school without money for their lunch. We would hope that this number would remain low from day to day as it causes additional administrative burdens on the school. The school has no facility to give pupils change for the machine so we ask that you ensure your child has the correct money.

Pupils whose balance falls below £1.95 or who forget money will be issued with a 'virtual voucher' and a text message will be sent by the staff in the school office. The money 'loan' £1.95 should be returned to your child's account the following day, in order to balance the books – the school office do not collect this money.




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#### St John's Church Fete

#### E-Mail



Here at St Mark's we are trying very hard to keep parents regularly informed about what is going on in the school; sending letters home can be rather unreliable with parent/carers either receiving multiple copies or letters going astray. A letter will be sent out next week to P1 parents requesting support from parents/Carers for email addresses. Can we please ask that you return the

tear off slip which came with the letter indicating whether or not you wish to receive communication by e-mail (can we please ask that you write your child's name on the tear off slip) - we will be in contact soon to let parents know when the transition to e-mail will begin.

#### Medication

If your child is required to take any medicine during the course of the school day you must visit the school office and complete a consent/request pro-forma which will ensure that all medicines are ÷

administered safely. No child should be given medicine to take without the school having been informed.

#### GLOW

Glow is the name for the Scottish Schools Digital Network. The aim of GLOW is to promote creative learning and teaching in the classroom by fully supporting the delivery of Curriculum for Excellence. Over the next few weeks, every child from Primary 5 to 7



will be reminded of their username and updated password. P6 and P7 are already updating their personal details in their e-portfolios on GLOW. This means GLOW can be accessed at school and at home. This will provide an excellent opportunity for children to showcase their work at different times throughout the year. Over this term, remaining pupils apart from P1 will be given updated passwords to enable to access GLOW. P1 will be given their passwords later.

#### Children and Young People's Regional Summit

Some of the topics the pupils discussed were the curriculum, resources and funding, children's rights and tackling poverty.
