Adverse Weather

In the past, over the winter months, we have had severe disruption as a result of bad weather. In the event of a similar situation arising this winter we have put a few strategies in place. East Renfrewshire schools will only be closed in extreme circumstance.



- If the school is closed during the course of a school day you will be contacted, in the first instance, by text message. Please ensure we have a current mobile phone number on our records for this purpose.
- The text will ask you to make arrangements to collect your child as soon as possible. You cannot reply to this message.
- Please don't telephone the school unless absolutely necessary as we have a limited number of external lines.
- Your child will be kept here until someone comes for him/her.
- Once the school has been officially closed regular updates will be posted on the East Renfrewshire and school website and updates posted on Twitter and Facebook.

In the event of heavy snow, as first priority, our janitor will clear a path to the breakfast club door from the stairs. Look out for signs directing you if we have to make any changes to the usual routine.

The pupils were guided through the United Kingdom's most publicized Art award. Their intellectual and creative response more than impressed the curators and learning officers at the venue! This experience will hopefully fuel some stimulating discussion at St Mark's ARTiculate 2016. This year's focus will be talks based on Photography, linking with the photography club. This club will learn photography techniques, discover classic black and white and colour photographers, use both film and digital technology to create images and manipulate photographs. The children will also benefit and gain inspiration by attending a workshop with Zoe Bannatyne (Edinburgh photographer) and opportunities given through SCRAN to showcase work online.
