

#### <u>Parking</u>

Can I please once again remind parents and carers dropping off and picking up children to be considerate when stopping and parking. Please DO NOT park over or in our neighbours' driveways (yes some people have been caught!!!!) particularly at the corner of Fenwick Drive. Please remind your child to be polite and respectful to our neighbours when entering and leaving the school.

#### Air Quality Around Schools!!

As part of our commitment to improving local air quality, East Renfrewshire Council now has powers to issue fixed penalty notices to drivers who don't switch off their engines when stationary. Council officers will be carrying out patrols around local schools and speaking to drivers who let their vehicles idle unnecessarily.

Air quality within East Renfrewshire is generally good and meets national standards, however we are always keen to make further improvements. Within East Renfrewshire, road traffic is the main source of air pollutants. Parents and others taking children to and from school can help to reduce children's exposure to exhaust fumes by leaving the car at home, by parking further away from the school and by turning off their engines when stationary.

#### Good Hygiene - Good Health

If your child requires medication throughout the day, please remember that you must complete an administration of medicine form in order that medicine can be given to your child by a member of staff. Forms can be obtained from the school office.



## Lunch Money

Can we please once again remind parents to encourage children to put their lunch money in the catering machine as soon as they come to school in the morning. We continue to champion the use of the on-line payment system by parents, avoiding the need to give cash to your child.

## Outdoor Learning

In St. Mark's pupils participate in outdoor learning which can deliver key features of Curriculum for Excellence. Schools across Scotland are demonstrating a real commitment to encouraging and supporting their children and young people to develop as successful learners, responsible citizens, effective contributors and confident individuals. We are all considering the best ways to provide genuinely enjoyable and challenging learning experiences.

Many of these experiences will be found outside the classroom and we would therefore ask that you ensure your child comes to school with appropriate outdoor clothing for our inclement weather. Children can bring in a change of shoes for indoors and keep these in a bag on their coat peg to change into. We have waterproof jackets available for children, but would ask that you encourage your child to wear their jackets, wellingtons, hats etc. when outdoors, or on an excursion.

## Holiday Reminder

The school will close on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> October at 3.00pm (clubs will run as normal) for the October school break, we reopen Monday 19<sup>th</sup> October 8.45am with Breakfast Club running as normal from 8am.



You will all be aware of the plight of refugees mainly from Syria and the efforts many of you have already made to send aid to charitable or aid organisations to support families who now find themselves homeless and in great need of help. Councillor Waters is co-ordinating aid to those who are held in refugee camps in Calais and is organising a convoy which leaves on Thursday 29 October. We are looking for donations of the following things which are much needed and in very short supply are:

- small torches;
- double AA batteries for torches;
- tea lights; and
- jars and packets of ready to eat baby food.







The general list the Aid organisations are asking for include:

- warm clothing for men and boys;
- waterproof clothing for men and boys;
- sturdy footwear for men, women and children (all sizes and all ages);
- camping equipment in working order;
- basic toiletries (soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste etc); and,
- transportable food (anything non-perishable, e.g. tinned food, rice etc).

The group will accept other types of clothing donations as they will always find a use for them.

Please hand in any items to the school no later than Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> October. Many thanks for your continued support.
