What is Transition?

Transitions are the moves children and young people make from one stage to the next in their educational journey.

Transitions and changes are part of everyone's life. The vast majority of children and young people look forward to moving on. However, transitions can sometimes be challenging and support from parents and staff can help transitions to go more smoothly.

In St. Luke's Cluster, we nurture every child's unique God-given talents to enable them to flourish in a climate of high expectations, innovation and creativity. This nurturing approach informs our transition programme and puts your child at the centre of the process.

What to expect

We will work closely with you and your child's early learning and childcare setting to ensure we get to know your child as well as we can before they start Primary 1 in August.

As part of this process, your child is invited to attend two transition sessions in St. Mark's. These sessions will take place on:

- **Tuesday 8th June, 3:30 – 4:30pm**
- **Tuesday 15th June, 3:30 – 4:30pm**

During these visits, children will play, tour the school and take part in various activities in the Primary 1 classrooms and our outdoor space. They will meet their classmates, their Primary 1 teachers and other key members of the St. Mark's staff team. The emphasis is very much on building relationships and feeling safe, happy and confident in their new environment.

Children should be dropped and collected at the main gate of the school, where school staff and staff from Arthurlie Family Learning Centre will be on hand to support.

How can you help?

It helps children and young people at all transitions if parents/ carers:

- talk with them about what is going to happen
- encourage them to ask questions
- encourage them to talk about any concerns they may have
- listen carefully to their concerns and consider sharing them with other relevant people
- help them to become familiar with the new school or setting and what will be expected of them.
