School represented St. Luke's cluster for remote learning.

Google form survey for P4-7 – some interested findings. When asked "have you enjoyed learning from home?" 25% replied Yes and 57% sometimes. Some further questions were asked to provide reasons for this 58% responded saying they had just enough work and 39% said too much work.
