Head Teachers Report	<p>Thanks to all who participated in the fundraising efforts (Christmas Cards) and the class party contributions. Today the 9th Eco Flag was hoisted during outdoor play, serenaded by the choir and backed by pupils. Halloween class parties seem to have went down well and a balance was achieved between structure and fun day. Thanks to parents who participated in the focus group which was a follow on from the 2018 HMI Inspection. This was an elongated process due to Covid 19 disruption. This led to many of the previous recommendations being already implemented and/or forming a part of the current School Improvement Plan. The visitors were positive about progress in the school and praised staff and pupils. The pupils were brilliant throughout, particularly in the classroom visits. The observations of the visitors were in line with school self evaluation. An A4 leaflet will be published regarding the inspection follow up.</p> <p>The school applied for funding via Education Scotland and the Creative Learning Network. The brief was that applicants had to partner an organisation outside of the school – Local Authority or Third Sector. In line with this, and focussing on the school's 60th Anniversary year, we partnered with the Heritage and Arts Officer from ERC Culture and Leisure and local visual arts groups and were successful to the figure of £5,100 – which was the full amount claimed for (budget was circa £160,000 split between 32 LA's in Scotland). This will allow the school to hold Heritage and Art workshops for every class and an exhibition event at the end of 12 months. These workshops will begin in educational term 2, Mid-November. Regarding Christmas events – such as the nativity and carol concert – the school are in dialogue with the LA in relation to permitting visitors to these events. There is no change to the current national guidance indicated but will keep all pupils and families updated as we get closer to the festive season. Very keen to be responsible and not add to the already stretched NHS.</p> <p>In reference to Chairs description of the consultation event on education reform – the school is participating in a dual role of a LA School and a Catholic school at the request of Scottish Catholic Education Society (by way of a questionnaire).</p>
