




## What makes a successful pupil?







#### Uniform

- Maroon blazer with school badge
- Knee length grey skirt
- Grey trousers (not black)
- Pale blue or white shirt
- Grey cardigan or V-neck jumper (No hoodies)
- Black school shoes (not trainers)
- Tie (fixed appropriately)





#### **PE Uniform**

- Sky blue polo shirt
- Black/Navy shorts, tracksuit/jogging trousers, sports leggings
- Training shoes which have built in support (not fashion shoes)
- Absolutely <u>no football</u> or <u>designer</u> tops, shorts or tracksuit trousers.
- Jewellery should <u>NOT</u> be worn in Physical Education.





- preparing reports on pupils for employers, colleges, universities, etc.
- contacting parents of individual pupils by letter, telephone, interview and meeting
- linking with supporting agencies such as the Careers` Service, Social Work,
   Community Organisations, etc.
