SQA Exam Results 2023

I wrote to you before the school year finished regarding this year's examination results. On Tuesday the 8th August, all pupils who sat national exams will receive their results by first class post. Those pupils who signed up to MySQA will receive their exam results by text and email.

Listed below is advice to both you and our young people to support them on receiving their results:

- Candidates will receive their certificates by first class post or electronically. Mr Cumming will be available in school on that day with other members of the SLT to deal with results queries. **0141 577 2000.**
- If you have a query regarding an appeal, please complete the online form using the link below. Request for a priority appeal must be submitted by Monday 14th of August, whilst all other request must be submitted by Friday 18th August. (Information regarding the appeals process is given below.)

Appeals 2023

Appeals 2023 has a different process to the one used last year as alternative assessment evidence will not be considered. This year, if you appeal your grade, a senior marker will carry out a marking review of your SQA-marked assessments.

This is not a re-mark.

A marking review checks that:

- all parts of your SQA-assessments have been marked
- the marking is in line with national standards
- the marks given for each answer have been totalled correctly and
- the correct result has been entered on our system.

Please note that after being reviewed, your result could stay the same, go up or go down.

If your child through the Examination Exceptional Circumstances Consideration Service (EECCS) they cannot use the Appeals 2023 service for the same qualification. This is because the EECCS has already included a review, by SQA senior appointees, of their assessment evidence.

Priority Appeals

An appeal can be prioritised if your child has a conditional place at university or college, or in training or employment that depends on their grade.

Before submitting a request for an appeal, you should look at the final report your child received in March as this contained each candidate's estimated grades. (This is available on ParentPortal) They should be compared with the results your child received. Any discrepancy between the estimated grade and the final grade may result in your child being eligible for an appeal.
