



- Sky blue polo shirt
- Black/Navy shorts, tracksuit/jogging trousers, sports leggings
- Training shoes which have built in support (not fashion shoes)
- Absolutely <u>no football</u> or <u>designer</u> tops, shorts or tracksuit trousers.
- Jewellery should <u>NOT</u> be worn in Physical Education.


Overall how enjoyable did you find the P7 cluster visits?




