Dear Colleague,

Welcome to the latest edition of Centred on Christ.

This year, as you aware, there has been significant staffing changes in the Diocesan Education team. Neil Roarty has retired, Anne Marie Mullan continues as Primary Advisor, Alison Fanning has been appointed Secondary Advisor and I've taken on the role of Director of Schools. It is anticipated that these changes will continue to enable the department to offer advice and support to all schools.

We circulated the **Diocesan Education Strategic Plan** last term. It is also on TEAMS. The Strategic Plan 2025/26, which has a slightly smaller number of targets, seeks to continue to build on the work of previous years working closely with colleagues to support the faith formation of our young people. Our Plan, based upon the views of Head Teachers, R.E. Co-ordinators, Principal Teachers of R.E., Chaplains and our Parent Forum, is also a very ambitious document. It is hoped that schools will be able to identify **some** key targets which they could include in their School Improvement Plans.

We are grateful for your *Developing in Faith* returns which were hugely encouraging, demonstrating the commitment of schools to provide quality experiences for children and young people and to put Christ at the centre of their schools. We will share the good practice in the reports across the diocese and will fine-tune our Strategic Plan on the basis of your requests for support.

On Thursday 9th October, the **Afternoon of Reflection on Christ amongst the Teachers** will be given by Fr.Tom Kilbride and will conclude with Mass celebrated by Bishop John in the Cathedral. There will be a joint **Head Teacher and Clergy meeting** in the Cathedral Halls on Thursday 12th March 2026.

This edition highlights a number of events that have taken place within schools to celebrate the **Jubilee Year of Hope.** As well as highlighting the **St. Carlo Acutis Relic** visit.

Our **CLPL programmes** for this session have been circulated to schools.

The Diocesan Parent Forum met on Monday 22nd September in the Diocesan Offices. The main items discussed were updates on the Year of Hope, St.Carlo Acutis Relic Visitation and the further Scottish Government consultation on Religious Observance. A copy of the Departmental response to this consultation can be found on TEAMS.

A reminder that **Themes for Prayers and Reflection** are available on TEAMS/ Education Resources for Schools/Prayers and Assemblies and the Vocations Week and Mission channels. The main themes for this term are Vocations Week, Season of Creation, the Rosary and the Missions. We would ask that October First Friday Masses and the daily decade of the Rosary be offered for the Missions.

Introduction

St. Anthony's, as a Catholic school, have embraced the Year of Hope with a strong focus on deepening faith, fostering prayer, and strengthening our community. Our celebrations and initiatives have been rooted in the Gospel values of faith, service, and witness.



Symbolising Our Journey

We created a doorway display to represent our ongoing journey of hope. This visual focus has allowed children and staff to contribute prayers, reflections, and artwork, creating a shared symbol of our faith journey throughout the year. Our school community will be presented with a Year of Hope Badge, recognising the journey we have all been on.

Liturgical Life and Parish Links

Our school community has been closely involved in parish Masses, in a renewed effort to encourage families to return to Mass. Pupils and staff prepare in school during the week to take active roles in leading the readings, offertory, and music on Sundays. This has strengthened our bond with the parish and helped our children grow in understanding of the Mass as central to Catholic life.



Rosary Prayer Sessions

In honour of Our Lady, we organised rosary sessions during key liturgical seasons. Pupils developed reverence in prayer and grew in confidence as they led decades of the rosary. These sessions encouraged reflection, peace, and hope, and were well supported by staff and families.

Evangelisation and Witness



We have explored practical ways to share the Gospel message within our school and parish. Acts of service, the creation of prayer cards, and prayers of hope for those in need have given children opportunities to put faith into action. Pupils have begun to see evangelisation not only as words but as living witnesses of kindness, love, and hope.

Through our doorway display, our participation in parish Masses, our prayerful rosary sessions, and our focus on evangelisation, we have celebrated the Year of Hope as a true school and parish family. These experiences have strengthened the faith of our pupils and staff and will continue to inspire us as we look forward to the next stage of our spiritual journey.


Our Lady of the Missions: Jubilee Year of Hope Angela O'Connor

Pilgrims in the Park: Inverclyde's Catholic Schools Unite in Faith

Over 200 enthusiastic Primary 7 pupils from all the Catholic Primary Schools of Inverclyde gathered in Darroch Park this September for a joyful celebration titled "Pilgrims in the Park." The event marked a special moment in the Jubilee Year of Hope, bringing together young people in prayer, reflection and fellowship.

Supported by their Parish Priests and joined by the Diocesan Director of Schools, pupils spent the morning exploring the lives of their patron saints, discovering how these inspiring figures can guide them in their own spiritual journeys and praying each of the schools' prayers. Father Danny of St Andrew's led the gathering in moments of prayer and reflection, creating a space for stillness and connection with God amid the beauty of nature.

CARITAS students from Inverclyde's three Catholic Secondary Schools, St Stephen's, Notre Dame and St Columba's, played a vital role in supporting the event, offering leadership and encouragement to the younger pupils throughout the day.

Thanks to the generous support of Inverclyde Council, Darroch Park became a sacred space for the day — a place where faith was celebrated, friendships were deepened, and hearts were opened to God's presence.

"Pilgrims in the Park" was more than just an event — it was a living expression of community, purpose and peace. The idea was born after Inverclyde Primary Headteachers attended the annual CHAPS conference where we were inspired to bring the spirit of shared pilgrimage into the lives of our pupils.



What followed was a beautiful day of reflection and unity. As pupils walked together in faith, they were reminded that their spiritual journey is not a solitary one, but a path shared with others — united in prayer, joy and hope.



This special gathering served as a powerful reminder that when we walk together, we grow together.

Education Department Strategic Plan Summary 2025-26

1. Continuing to build up the Diocesan Family of Schools and work in partnership with stakeholders and Church Agencies to achieve shared goals

1.1 To embed Developing in Faith and Diocesan toolkits within schools' self-evaluation processes in order to facilitate the identification of schools' support needs and the sharing of good practice across the Diocese.

- 3.3 To continue to plan, implement and review the Diocesan Secondary curriculum in the Broad General Education phase and provide appropriate information for parents on the revised course.
- 3.4 To continue to review and enhance the Senior Phase R.E. programme in collaboration with schools.
- 3.5 To continue to work with SPRED and further develop links between schools, SPRED and the Diocesan Education Department.
- 3.6 To nurture the spiritual development of children and young people by continuing to participate in the Holy Year, taking forward the legacy of the Carlo Acutis Eucharistic Miracles Encounter and supporting the introduction of Generation Hope Hubs in Secondary Schools.

4. Strengthening Home-School-Parish Links by Supporting Parents, Chaplains and Schools

- 4.1 To continue to share and extend good practice in Home-School-Parish partnerships.
- 4.2 To further develop the Diocesan Parent Forum as a means of consulting parent representatives and developing support for Parent Councils and to contribute to the National Catholic Education Forum (SCES).
- 4.3 To continue to deliver support for school chaplains and to continue to engage with schools in further developing arrangements which support the work of chaplains

On Wednesday 10th of September, our school community was deeply honoured to receive a first-class relic of the newly canonised St Carlo Acutis. The Oratory was filled to capacity, standing room only, as Bishop John, joined by a delegation from the diocese and Assisi, formally entrusted the relic to our care.

The reception ceremony was centred around the Eucharist, reflecting St Carlo's profound devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Pupils from our Caritas cohort led the service with Hymns and scripture readings that were selected to remind us all of the profound gift of the Eucharist. The service culminated in a heartfelt homily from Bishop John. He spoke directly to the young people present, describing St Carlo as "one of their own" - a teenager who lived holiness in the everyday.





FOSTERING FAITH. DEVELOPING FRIENDSHIPS.

In these days following the visit of the first-class relics of the newly canonised St Carlo Acutis, we are given an opportunity to reflect upon what was a time of many graces for our wider diocesan family. As the coordinator of the visit, I was privileged to accompany the relic around the diocese and witness the faith of so many people—young and old—as they venerated the relic and asked for St Carlo's powerful intercession.

As Vicar Episcopal for Youth, I was delighted that the first Acutis Evening of the new term could take place in the presence of the relics. This was a special moment of grace for all involved: Monsignor Anthony and Jacquie, who brought the relic and the exhibition on Eucharistic miracles; the members of the Youth Commission who facilitated the evening; and especially the young people who attended.

Monsignor Anthony spoke with the young people about his own vocation story and the life of Carlo, encouraging them to hear and respond to their own personal call to holiness. After dinner and a chance to socialise, Jacquie spoke with them about Eucharistic devotion and the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Finally, everyone spent some time in prayerful adoration of the Blessed Sacrament by candlelight, with some young people moved to tears.

A moment that moved me especially came after dinner, after Monsignor Anthony had been listening to what the young people were saying to one another about their experiences and their interest in Carlo. He asked me to encourage them to offer their own thoughts and testimonies. I was cynical; I assumed that no one would have the courage to do so. I was wrong. Two young people—one of whom had not attended Holy Mass for a long time—spoke in a heartfelt way about Carlo's influence on their lives, and about how his 5-step approach to holiness had resonated with them.

Following the visit of the relics, the Acutis Evenings allow us to build a legacy for the future in the Diocese of Paisley. They are a fruit of insightful meetings with senior pupils across the diocese in January and February 2025. Most senior pupils with whom the Youth Commission met stated that they had a desire for some form of catechesis and community outside of school. We teased this out with them and the result was the launch of a new initiative, one which I hope will have a lasting impact on our young people, our schools and our parishes.

Our Acutis Evenings will take place on the first Friday of every month (in term time), from 6-8pm. They were launched in St Mirin's Cathedral Precincts before the summer holidays, but the Youth Commission is now under the impression that St James's in Paisley is a more suitable venue. They were launched under the patronage of then-Blessed Carlo Acutis, whose intercession has often been sought by many people across the diocese, not least of all our young people.

Currently, these events are open to pupils in S4, S5 and S6. We hope that once they are established, we can open them up to pupils in S1, S2 and S3 (with events tailored to them). At that point, we will have to return to St Mirin's Cathedral for these events.

Parents and guardians must register their young people (once) for these events.

A Journey of Faith: My Pilgrimage to Rome as a Young Catholic Teacher

In July 2025, I was blessed with the incredible honour of being selected to represent the Diocese of Paisley on the Young Catholic Teachers Jubilee Pilgrimage to Rome. To experience this not only as a young Catholic of our diocese but also as a young Catholic teacher was truly life-changing. My faith is something I have always cherished but this pilgrimage has sparked a new fire in me, one that I now carry into my vocation as I begin my permanent post at St. Clare's.

The journey was filled with profound moments that deepened my love of the Church and reminded me of the responsibility and joy of being both a Catholic and a teacher. Beginning our pilgrimage with visiting the Baptistery of St. John Lateran grounded me in the reminder of where our faith begins. Afterwards, we shared our first meal together which was a beautiful way to begin building connections. The opportunity to socialise and form friendships with fellow young Catholic teachers set the tone for the pilgrimage, reminding me how valuable community is in walking this journey of faith together.

The following day proved to be the most profound and unforgettable of the pilgrimage as we were blessed with the incredible privilege of meeting Pope Leo in a private audience, a moment that will remain in my heart forever. The anticipation, excitement and nerves all began to build up as we were welcomed into a private audience with Pope Leo. His words about the importance of listening with our hearts resonated deeply. In a noisy world, we risk losing the ability to hear God's voice. Yet it is in our hearts that God speaks most clearly, inviting us to know Him better and to love Him more. Being personally greeted by the Holy Father was an unforgettable grace.


The pilgrimage also took us to Pompeii, where we walked the archaeological site and reflected on the fragility of life. Back in Rome, we were enriched by tours of the Vatican Museums and Gardens and we had the extraordinary grace of passing through all four Holy Doors, each a profound sign of God's mercy. Another special moment came through our Q&A with members of the Dicastery, which gave us practical insights and renewed inspiration to live out our vocations in today's world.

Throughout our time in Rome we stayed at the Irish College, which provided a wonderful place for us as young teachers to stay, offering opportunities to socialise, build friendships, and make lasting connections with one another. Yet one of the most moving highlights was our day trip to Assisi, where we venerated and prayed at the tomb of Blessed Carlo Acutis and celebrated Mass in the same church. To pray at the resting place of a young saint-in-the-making, whose witness speaks powerfully to today's generation, was deeply humbling and inspiring.

As I reflect on this journey I realise how it has not only deepened my personal faith but also renewed my sense of mission as a teacher. Teaching is about being a seed planter, nurturing faith, kindness and love in young hearts. This pilgrimage has taught me also to be a keeper of the fire: to keep alive the flame of faith and hope for the children I will teach, guiding them towards God's love.

This pilgrimage was not only a privilege but a gift. A gift that has strengthened me, inspired me and set me alight with a renewed desire to live my faith joyfully in the classroom and beyond.


