Covid Thank you

Over the past 24 months, throughout the Covid outbreak, you have shown me what a fantastic community St Thomas' and Neilston is. I am so grateful to all of you, for your support and understanding.

Throughout the crisis, our resolute aim has been to support the health and wellbeing of our children. We have continued to focus on being warm, welcoming and nurturing in all our interactions.

We have really missed having our open door policy, but hope you still feel a strong connection with the school. Please know how much we value your contributions. We genuinely do see our parents as key partners in the education process for our children. When school and home work together, magic happens for our learners!

I really hope our children have felt a sense of normality, safety and routine by being at school, in whatever form that has happened to take (online, hub schools), over the past couple of years.

Covid Updates

I am pleased to announce some further updates to our Risk Assessment, which we will apply from **Monday 7th March**.

- All children may now enter the school building via the infant doors from 8.50am (we will keep all doors open for the next couple of weeks until children get used to coming in the same door again)
- **School will finish at 3.05pm for all children.** P1-3 will exit via the infant doors, P4, 5 and 6 will exit via their usual doors and P7 will exit via the P7 door. Please advise your children where they should meet you after the school day.
- There is still a requirement for staff to wear masks in communal areas. You may choose to wear a mask in our playground, although this is no longer mandatory.
- Physical distance of 1metre between adults is still mandatory within the school and school grounds

Talent Show

As a result of the reduction in restrictions, we can now have face to face assemblies again! The most exciting news of all is that there will be a WHOLE SCHOOL TALENT SHOW (A REALLY BIG FUN ASSEMBLY) for children on Friday 11th March. Each class will vote for 2 acts to go forward.
