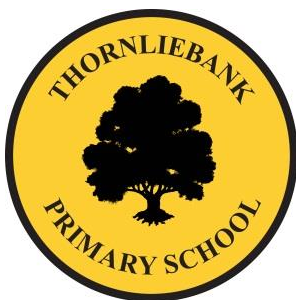

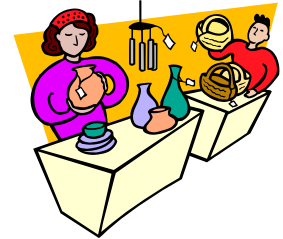


Dear Parent/Carer

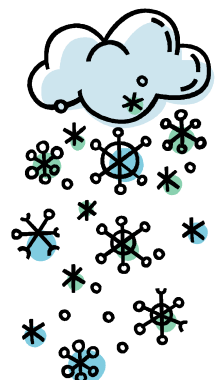
Support

Rights Respecting School

We would like to thank you for your overwhelming generosity in our recent collection sending items to help Syrian Refugees. Pupils have been learning all about rights respecting behaviour and how they can help other children who do not enjoy their lives.

Our P7 Peer Mediators have been working hard to support pupils throughout the school during playtime and lunch time. They are helping younger children enjoy their right to feel safe in school.

The steering group have been working hard to make playground and lunch time charters which will link their rights with the associated rights respecting behaviour. These charters are almost completed and will be shared with all children.

Sponsored Super Hero Obstacle Challenge

A massive well done to all our nursery children and staff who took part in a sponsored obstacle challenge on Friday. The pupils and staff all dressed as superheroes and navigated their way around an obstacle course. This was to raise funds for the nursery and Children in Need. Wrap staff

We are looking to recruit some more wrap staff in our nursery. Wrap staff are employed to look after the children in nursery either before nursery starts, during lunch time or after the nursery finishes.

The exact hours are 8am -9am, 11.50am-12.50pm and 4.00pm-6.00pm. The current rate of pay for wrap is £8.26 per hour. In order to be eligible to do wrap you would need a PVG with East Renfrewshire Council and be registered with SSSC.
