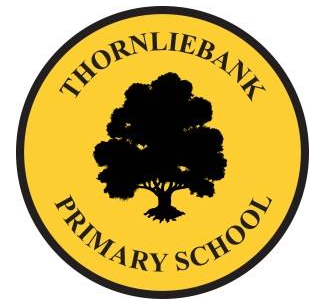

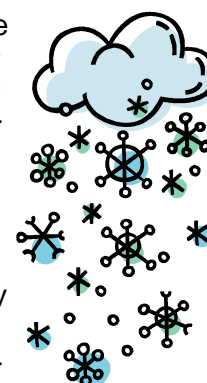

Children are learning about the skills needed for learning, life and work throughout the year in all that they do. This focused week is an opportunity to hear from experts about how these skills are put into action in specific jobs. It culminated in our fantastic 'Dress for the Future Day' where the children had the opportunity to think about a possible future career. Thank you to Mrs McGarvey and Mrs McDonald for organising this week and to Sainsbury's for inviting out Primary 5s on a 'behind the scenes' visit.



Right on Time Week

The week beginning 14th November was Right on Time Week and every class rose to the challenge of being the class with the highest overall average percentage of children arriving right on time at five to nine. Being on time helps our children start the day in a positive, relaxed way and ensures they get the best from their learning. We encourage being right on time throughout the year but use Right on Time week as a way of highlighting the importance of punctuality. The children did extremely well and the results were as follows:



P1- 95.4%

P2- 97.6%

P3- 94.2%

P4- 93.8%

P5- 93.3%

P6- 95.6%

P7- 96.4%

As you can see, Primary 2 was our overall winning class and the children have earned themselves an additional playtime for their efforts.

NHS Guidance

NHS guidance states that children with sickness or diarrhoea should not return to school until at least 48 hours after their last bout of illness. This is obviously very important within a primary school in order to prevent the spread of infection and I would be grateful if you could be mindful of this advice. Children who are sick in the evening or during the night should not attend school or ELCC the following day under any circumstances.

In order to prevent the spread of head lice, it is important to regularly check and comb through your child's hair.



Safe Travel

Our Junior Road Safety Officers will shortly be meeting to refresh and update Thornliebank's Travel Plan. If you have an interest in promoting safe travel and would

be willing to support staff and children in reviewing their plan, I would be grateful to hear from you.

It is important that we work as a community to promote road safety and I would urge all car users, particularly those dropping off or parking on Bangorshill Street, to use extreme caution when pulling in or away from the kerb. There have been reports of several near misses lately and it is important if you have to drive to school, you take full responsibility for all our children's safety. If you witness anyone driving carelessly and endangering our children, I would also urge you to contact the police as soon as possible.

Congratulations go to Aimee (P6) and Alex (P2) for achieving Highly Commended awards for their entries in East Renfrewshire's road safety competition.
