Nut-free School



Please remember that we are a nut-free school, due to a number of children with severe allergies. Children should not bring snacks or lunch items containing nuts, including Nutella. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

School Uniform

Parent Council

Our Parent Council continue to work hard organising fundraising activities to help fund activities for children across the school. Last year, the Parent Council paid for buses for every class to go on an educational visit, as well as paying for the buses for the whole school and nursery trip at the end of the year. Without this help we would need to charge parents and carers considerably more for these trips, so we are very grateful for this support. Please look out for upcoming events including the Hallowe'en Discos and Christmas Fayre, and try to support the Parent Council wherever you can.

Building Works in the Main Building

As part of the development of our Gaelic Medium Education provision, some building work is currently taking place in the main building. The boys' toilets are being refurbished, followed by the girls', and some of the classrooms are having other improvements and adaptations. You will probably have noticed the site office and equipment in our staff car park since the work has started. Please be reassured that everyone is ensuring that the main building is still safe for all of our children while this work is ongoing.

Celebrating Achievements

We are always keen to share achievements in Thornliebank and have been doing this at weekly assemblies this term. Each week, a pupil from each class is awarded a Values Certificate for demonstrating one of our core values (Nurture, Kindness, Respect and Effort). We have also been celebrating wider achievements at assembly so please let us know if your child has something to celebrate from outside of school.

Some of you may already know that Reverend Mike Gargrave from Thornliebank Parish Church is retiring at the end of October. Mike has supported our school and nursery for many years now, helping with RME lessons, contributing to assemblies, hosting assemblies in his church and running lunchtime clubs and afterschool clubs for our children. His Hot Chocolate Café has been a particularly big hit! We are going to really miss Mike when he retires and we would like to wish him happiness and health for the future. Mike will be joining us for one last assembly on 30th October.

School Absences and Latecoming

If your child arrives late to school and the children have already gone inside with their teacher, please bring your child to the school office and they will be taken to their class from there. Please remember, school starts at 9.00pm. If your child is going to be absent from school, please call the school office as early as possible to let us know. If your child has an appointment during the school day, please let us know so we can get them ready to be collected at the office.

Breakfast Cart and Playground Supervision

We are very fortunate to have a Breakfast Cart in Thornliebank, funded by East Renfrewshire Council, which is available for all children every morning between 8.45 and 9.00am. The children can come in via the gym hall door and help themselves to some toast or some fruit. Please note that there is playground supervision from 8.45am and we ask that children (especially younger children) do not arrive before this time without an adult as there will be no one in the playground to keep them safe.

Family Support

We have a new Family First link worker at Thornliebank. Seona Lawless has taken over from Julie Douglas and is in school, based in the Family Room on Fridays to offer a variety of support. We also have a new Bilingual Support Worker in school on Mondays. Faryal Choudhry is supporting some of our children for whom English is a second language, as well as linking in with parents and families to provide support. Nicola from the financial inclusion service is based in our school each Wednesday morning in the Family Room and can help with any claims for Free School Meals, Uniform Grants and other help with cost of living.
