Cost of Living Support

A reminder of the supports we have in school and through our partners to help with the increased cost of living. We have a school Food Larder which is outside our school and available for all to take what they need and give what they can. Our Recycled School Uniform Rail in our Family Room can be accessed at any time by contacting Mrs McGarvey and will be open most Wednesday afternoons from 2.30 until 2.55pm. We also have food vouchers available as a short term support for anyone in financial difficulty.

Playtime Snacks

We are finding an increasing number of pupils are accessing our school snack box which is kept in school for those children who may not have or have forgotten their snack. If you wish your child to have a playtime snack please include 1 small snack in their school bag or ensure there is money in their account through Parent Pay for them to buy tuck. Please can we also remind you that your child should have a suitable water bottle with them to school as well. We may contact families whose children are accessing the box regularly to check if any of our Cost Of Living supports would help with any financial difficulty.

Nut-free School

Please remember that we are a nut-free school, due to a number of children with severe allergies. Children should not bring snacks or lunch items containing nuts, including Nutella. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

Lost Property

Can we please ask that all items of uniform and clothing are named. We are having an increasing number of lost jackets and jumpers which are unnamed. It is almost impossible to return the correct items especially black sweatshirts and cardigans to pupils when they are not named. Last term a huge amount of lost property was recycled into our school uniform rail. If you require any items of uniform please ask to access our recycle rail or speak with Mrs McGarvey.

Head Lice

We have had a few reported cases of head lice in school. Please remember to check your child's hair regularly. The local pharmacy will be able to help recommend any treatments should these be required.
