We had a very special visitor called Ruaridh, who played us some traditional music on a variety of instruments including the bagpipes and whistle. Mr McColgan-Smith and Mrs McLaughlin also joined in on their fiddles. We all loved tapping and clapping along! Miss Cameron gave us an amazing demonstration of Highland Dancing and Mrs Campbell led the whole school in a Gaelic song that we had learned throughout the week. We are so lucky to host East Renfrewshire's Gaelic provision at Thornliebank and benefit from such a wide range of cultural experiences.

Parent Council

Our Parent Council continue to be an amazing support to the ongoing life and work of our nursery and school. As well as funding transport costs for all of our trips, they have been successful in securing a range of grants, which have helped us to make improvements to our outdoor areas. The children are loving the new wildlife/sensory garden in the upper playground, and we are delighted with our loose parts container which supports our learning across the curriculum, including in the STEM subjects. The Parent Council are currently applying to Thornliebank Together for funding to make improvement in the nursery garden and to facilitate an event for our nursery and their Grand-friends from Trust Housing. Seachdain na Gàidhlig 2024 | World Gaelic Week 2024

This was an extremely busy week across Thornliebank Primary and Bun-sgoil Ghàidhlig Thornliebank, as we celebrated World Gaelic Week for the first time in the school. All pupils learned Gaelic songs and greetings. There were opportunities for pupils in P2-P4 to take part in a Gaelic Bingo club and for P5-P7 pupils to take part in a Gaelic Duolingo club. Some pupils from the Nursery and up to P7 had the opportunity to try shinty in PE as we borrowed shinty equipment from another school. We welcomed visits from Bun-sgoil an Iar in Paisley for story and song sessions. Clas 1 had the opportunity to visit Bun-sgoil an Iar and try some step dancing. There were other opportunities for all classes to explore Gaelic stories and song, this culminated in the whole school singing a Gaelic song together at assembly. We ended the week at a whole school assembly on Friday 23rd February when we had a visiting musician, Ruairidh Buxton, showcasing traditional Scottish music. Some staff even played some instruments or demonstrated their Highland Dancing skills. A huge thank you to all involved our first Seachdain na Gàidhliq!
