To improve outcomes for learners through adapted teaching and learning approaches and how we design the curriculum


Place a focus on Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing

We will prioritise key curricular areas when we return in August. This does not mean other curricular areas will not be taught. We will teach these through interdisciplinary contexts (e.g The topic Vikings will be used to teach social studies, expressive arts and technology)

Develop approaches to outdoor learning

There will be an emphasis on outdoor learning this session. We aim to ensure this is a high quality learning experience which progresses attainment and achievement.

Improvement Target 3:

To raise attainment and achievement of our learners through identifying and closing attainment gaps

Develop staff confidence in data analysis and interpretation

There is a vast amount of data we can use to support us in raising attainment. Staff will develop their ability to use this to its best potential.

Identify gaps in learning and plan approaches to address these

We know following school closure everyone will be at different stages. We will use carefully chosen assessments to understand where children are at in their learning and how to make sure pace and progression is maintained. This will mean new groupings, targeted approaches and will influence learning at home.

Develop new assessment methods and use moderation to ensure high standards

Uplawmoor will develop and use a range of assessment methods to track progress and plan next steps in learning. We will use moderation (sharing standards) to make sure our assessments are robust and inform progression.
