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**Step up to Study** - A modular programme designed for those thinking of starting a new Career Path, wanting to do a degree but don't think they have the right qualifications or experience or - who have been away from education and training for a long time and want to return.

**Entry Requirements** No formal entry requirements are required - all applicants will be interviewed and advised on the best suite of subjects to fit their needs

**Description** These courses meet the needs of people who wish to return to education, change direction in their careers, get into university(via an Access course) - candidates will be able to choose from a range of subjects which can assist them with, mathematics, social science, engineering, science (chemistry, physics, biology, pharmacy), communication or IT.

They are excellent preparation for those wishing to enter one of our Access programmes next session (Access Nursing, Access Humanities/Social Science, Access Engineering, Access Radiography, Access Ophthalmics, Access Podiatry or Access Dietetics), these programmes are run through the Scottish Wider Access Programme (SWAP) to provide bridging into University Courses for mature candidates who have been out of education for a period. They can also be used as preparation for candidates wishing to start a full time advanced programme of study at college in August.

Full time attendance will attract bursary and fee support for eligible candidates

Part-time or Evening attendance - see college website for details.

**Course Content** A selection of credits selected from a range of units at appropriate levels in mathematics, social science, engineering, science (chemistry, physics, biology, physiology, pharmacy), communication or IT.

## Duration

- Full time 2-3 days a week January - June (18 weeks).
- Part time - 1 day a week January - June(18 weeks).
- Evening Class - 1 or two evenings a week depending on subjects January to June (18 weeks).

**Progression** Glasgow Kelvin College runs a range of full time courses starting in August 2017 which lead to further study or employment. Subject to progress on the STEUP programme candidates may be eligible to apply for:-

- SWAP Access Programmes - Access Nursing, Access Humanities/Social Science, Access Engineering, Access Radiography, Access Ophthalmics, Access STEM, Access Podiatry or Access Dietetics
- NC Applied Science (Level 5 or 6)
- HNC/D Applied Science or Industrial Bioscience
