Easyjet Baggage Information (correct at 19<sup>th</sup> June 2018)

What is my cabin baggage allowance?	ONE cabin bag Maximum size of 56 x 45 x 25cm including handles and wheels.
Is there a weight restriction on cabin baggage?	There is no weight restriction for cabin baggage. As long as you are able to place the bag into the overhead locker and get it out again without assistance then the bag will be accepted into the cabin.
Will my cabin bag be checked before I board?	Yes, your cabin bag will be checked for its size with a baggage gauge (the orange bag size baskets or cages) at the Bag Drop desk and at the boarding gate
What happens if my cabin bag is too big?	If your cabin bag is larger than the maximum cabin bag size (56 x 45 x 25cm including handles and wheels) the Bag Drop desk will ask you to check the bag into the aircraft hold and a charge of £32.00 will apply. If you go directly to the boarding gate and your cabin bag is larger than the maximum cabin bag size, your item will be checked into the aircraft hold and a charge of £45.00 will apply.
What happens if cabin storage is full? Will I have to put my bag in the hold?	We only have a limited amount of cabin space on the aircraft so on busy flights it's not always possible to fit everyone's cab bags on board the aircraft.  Overhead locker space is allocated on a first come first served basis and once the overhead lockers are full all remaining customers will be asked to put their cabin bags in the hold free of charge as long as their cabin bag does not exceed the maximum cabin bag size of 56 x 45 x 25cm.
What can't I bring with me in cabin baggage?	There are a number of things that aren't allowed to be taken on as cabin baggage, for example: explosives, knives, sharp objects, radioactive materials.  To find a full and up to date list of the things that aren't allowed, please look at our dangerous goods page.
Can I take anything extra to my cabin bag allowance?	You're allowed a few things in the cabin in addition to your cabin bag allowance:  an overcoat, a shawl, an umbrella, crutches, a walking frame/stick, one standard size bag of duty free goods from the departure lounge in the airport.
Can I carry liquids in cabin baggage?	You can bring liquids in your cabin baggage as long as they are stored in containers no bigger than 100ml and they are carried in a clear, re-sealable plastic bag with maximum dimensions of 20 x 20cm.  Each passenger can carry a maximum of 1000ml (e.g. 10 x 100ml). You'll need to present your bag at security and you may be asked to dispose of liquids that do not meet these requirements.

Easyjet Medicines and Medical Equipment Information (correct at 19<sup>th</sup> June 2018)

<p>You can carry medicine and medical equipment in the cabin free of charge in addition to the permitted cabin baggage allowance.</p> <p>If you need to carry a large quantity of medicines or medical equipment onboard, please get a medical certificate or a signed letter from your doctor listing all the items that you are taking with you. You might be asked to show it to an easyJet representative in the bag drop area or airport.</p>	
<p>Due to security restrictions please carry any <b>medication in liquid or gel form</b> in containers not holding more than 100ml.</p> <p>If your medication (vital or prescribed) exceeds 100ml, we'll ask you for a medical certificate which details exactly the medicine you're carrying.</p>	
<p>I've recently been ill or had surgery. Can I still fly?</p>	<p>If you are in any doubt regarding your fitness to fly, it is recommended that you seek advice from a doctor and obtain a certificate confirming your fitness to fly.</p>
<p>What should I do if I can no longer fly for medical reasons?</p>	<p>As our seats are non-refundable we won't be able to offer you a refund for any unused flights, even if you are unable to travel due to illness. In some circumstances, such as for medical reasons, your travel insurance may cover the cost of any unused flights.</p>
<p>I'm diabetic. Can I bring my hypodermic needles and insulin onboard?</p>	<p>Hypodermic needles and insulin are allowed in the aircraft cabin for medical purposes only. You must show your medical certification at the Bag Drop desk and security screening points.</p> <p>Please make sure that you carry sufficient supplies of insulin in your cabin baggage, rather than in your hold luggage. Insulin may be inactivated if carried in the hold due to freezing temperatures.</p> <p>If you're taking insulin or long acting sulphonylureas please take extra carbohydrates in your cabin bag and remain on "home-time" throughout the flight.</p> <p>Diabetic insulin pens are permitted for travel without medical documentation. Please note that injections required during the flight must be self-administered.</p> <p>Our cabin crew cannot administer any medication, including injections, under any circumstances. If you need to use a hypodermic needle on-board please advise the cabin crew who can arrange a sharps box for safe disposal of the needle.</p>
<p>What if I have a nut allergy?</p>	<p>We'll do all we can to help, but we cannot guarantee an allergy-free environment on board our aircraft or in our partner lounges.</p> <p>You should notify our cabin crew by <b>informing the cabin manager once you come on board.</b></p> <p>Please be aware that we do sell peanut products on board, so if do you suffer from <b>anaphylaxis, please notify the cabin crew when boarding the flight.</b> We will do all we can to help you by making announcements and stopping the sale of nut products on board however we cannot guarantee a 100% nut free environment.</p>
<p>I have asthma. Can I fly with you?</p>	<p>Asthma sufferers are able to carry inhalers and/or nebulisers provided that these do not contain oxygen cylinders.</p> <p>Passengers suffering from severe asthma or those who have recently been prescribed oral steroids will require certification confirming fitness to fly.</p>
