## Skills Profiles:

The aim of the booklet is to highlight progression of skills across the curriculum over S1-S3. The booklet will show progression and challenge using the thinking skills at each level. The booklets new layout and format should hopefully help pupils to articulate their skills across the curriculum and relate these to the world of work. Parents will be able to engage with the skills booklet at parents evening.

### S1 Booklet:

#### Thinking skills:

Creating and Remembering

This booklet is more of a scrap book format for pupils to identify and jot down their skills that they are developing.

### S2 Booklet:

#### Thinking skills:

Applying and Understanding

Reflect on the skills that they have used in S1. Collaborate and peer review each other's profiles.

### S3 Booklet:

#### Thinking skills: Analysing and Evaluating

Justify the use of the skills developed over the course of the BGE booklet and link these skills to possible career pathways  
 Review with parents over how skills are being applied at home  
 Consider skills needed at senior phase (around options choices)

## STEM Events:

STEM events run yearly with our cluster schools; helping to promote and encourage the uptake of STEM related subjects.



## PSHE Guest Speakers:

Former pupils are invited into S5 PSHE classes to share their experience after leaving school. They speak to the current S5's about their journey to success. This allows pupils to ask questions and gain a better insight into future decisions.



## Vocational Courses Whilst Studying:

Vocational courses provide the opportunity to gain practical experience and qualifications. They will help you to progress further in education and develop your skills for learning, life and work. You will also get a clear idea of what doing a job is actually like, so you will become better informed about particular careers before you leave school.

There is a range of options available for 2019/20, including courses in early education and childcare, health and social care, construction and engineering, fashion design, retailing, photography, sound engineering, hair and beauty, sport, and hospitality.






## Flexible Work Placements:

S4-S6 pupils can take part in flexible work placements whilst still in full time education. This allows pupils to develop the necessary skills and experiences whilst learning on the job. Pupils can also gain the skills for life, learning and work whilst gaining a qualification through their school subjects.
