
I can show how quantities that are related can be increased or decreased proportionally and apply this to solve problems in everyday contexts.

Level 4 Writing Benchmark:



This has been a very busy term in the English Department as all presentation classes have had a Folio of Writing to complete. This Folio of Writing contains two pieces, one Broadly Creative and one Broadly Discursive, and each piece is worth 15% of a pupil's final grade. It is vitally important for all pupils that they take time to review and edit their own work, based on feedback from their teacher. Take time to talk to your classes about your own proof-reading process and encourage them to always be vigilant for any writing mistakes they can identify.

Title: Surrounded by Idiots



Surrounded by Idiots is an international phenomenon, selling over 1.5 million copies worldwide. I have to admit that I was rather sceptical about reading this. How can anyone just divide humanity into 4 categories of behaviour? Is it a simplistic

approach to dealing with people? Thomas Erikson clarifies that there are four key behaviour types that define how we interact with and perceive the people around us. His main reference for this classification is Hippocrates the ancient Greek father of medicine.

He claims that understanding someone's pattern of behaviour is the key to successful

Shadowing Scottish Teenage Book Award 2020

The Scottish Teenage Book Prize is voted for by young people in schools and libraries across Scotland. I was very pleased Peter McNally's S1 decided to shadow this award. Starfish and One Shot were in my opinion excellent books with the common theme of female protagonists showing resilience to adversities.



The S1 pupils read the shortlisted books with patience and engaged in the related activities with creativity and eagerness. I was impressed by how quickly they were enthused and their eagerness to participate in the discussions and activities.

A most wonderful surprise was when the author of the very popular book "One Shot" Tanya Landman retweeted our message


communication. Erikson breaks down the four kinds of behaviour types - Reds who are dominant and commanding, Yellows who are social and optimistic, Greens who are laid back and friendly, and Blues who are analytical and precise - and explains how to identify and interact with each type of person. What is most interesting is that it has personal examples of team building failures and explains the "blind spots" that some categories have when actually assessing themselves. The Ancient Greek aphorism "Know yourself" seems the most difficult part of this typology, how can someone know for certain which categories resonate to their own character? However there are parts of this book that make it a decent read. It does provide insights into how we can adjust the way we speak and share information. Moreover it enhances empathy. After reading this book I felt more forgiving about the "blues" for example, they are not as bad as some people may think. Surrounded by Idiots will help you understand and communicate a little bit better with those around you. It offers practical advice as well as instruction on how to avoid being misunderstood. An essential read for leaders, coaches and perhaps teachers, it will give you an extra vocabulary of responsiveness when dealing with groups of people.

Kiki Dimoula was a member of the Academy of Athens. She has been awarded the Greek State Prize twice, the Grand State Prize, the Ouranis Prize, and the Aristeidion of Letters (given by the Academy of Athens), as well as the European Prize for Literature.

In a New York Times feature, Rachel Donadio described Dimoula's poetry as "spare, profound, unsentimental, effortlessly transforming the quotidian into the metaphysical, drawing on the powerful themes of time, fate and destiny, yet making them entirely her own."

Borrowbox is a collection of over 2,000 e-books and 280 e-audiobooks that you can read or listen to on your smartphone, tablet, computer or MP3 player.



You can borrow up to three e-book titles and three e-audiobook titles at a time for up to 21 days.

Step 1: Log in

Apps: Install the Borrowbox app on your devices.

Select East Renfrewshire Libraries and then enter your library barcode and 4 digit PIN.

Step 2: Search


Search, browse and discover the great collection 24/7, by title, author or category, read extracts, listen to excerpts and more.
