

### What is PECS?

- Develop by Andy Bondy and Lori Forst
- Alternative Augmentative Communication system
- Individuals with autism and developmental delays
- Low tech communication system



## Why use PECS?

- Focuses on initiating communication
- Builds on skills with reduced prompting
- Develops functional communication
- Leads to independent communication
- Some learners develop speech
- Some learners transition to speech generated system
- Emergent early literacy skills
- Prevents and reduces inappropriate behaviours



## Six Phases of PECS

- Motivators
- Phase I Exchange
- Phase II Distance and Persistence
- Phase III Picture Discrimination
- Phase IV Sentence Structure

Attributes and Language Expansion

- Phase V Answering Questions
- Phase VI Commenting
