

Curriculum News



Literacy

Our focus for literacy this term will be linked to our new topic, Fairtrade. In reading, we will be developing skills for finding, selecting and using information. This will include reinforcement of skimming and scanning skills, selecting information from a variety of sources and using context clues to understand new and unfamiliar words.

We also have a strong focus on reading for enjoyment this term. All children have a chance to take a book to read at home in order to create a book review to share with the class.

Numeracy

Problem solving and number talk remains at the heart of all numeracy experiences, and children have the opportunity to share their ideas and solutions with each other during our daily mental-maths input. The following areas of learning and skills will be explored this term:

Spheres	Cubes	Pyramids
Carrying out calculations using times tables 6, 7, 8 and 9. Describing, following and recording routes and journeys using signs, words and angles. Using a calendar to plan and organise events. Exploring the importance of maths and it's impact on the world.	Carrying out investigations and surveys and present the data in graphs. Creating function machines using the four operators. Estimating and measuring length in metres and centimetres. Applying the order of operations (BODMAS) when completing calculations.	Calculating elapsed time and reading timetables. Estimating and rounding to the nearest ten and hundred. Measuring volume and carrying out calculations in millilitres and litres. Reading graphs and identifying how they can be misleading.

Health and Wellbeing

Our focus for health and wellbeing this term will highlight the importance of eating healthily, exploring healthy recipes from around the world.

Social Studies

Primary Five are already enjoying our new Fairtrade topic. As always, our topic will take an interdisciplinary approach where the children will have the opportunity to apply their writing, digital and scientific reasoning skills to investigate sources and discover why Fairtrade is important and how we can help support it.
