



Hillview Primary School's Anti Bullying Policy

This policy was written by Pupils of Hillview Primary.

*Article 14 of the UNCRC says that **children and young people are free to be of any or no religion.** Their parents can help them make decisions around religion, but: a parent can't force a child or young person to adopt a religion, and. a parent can't force a child or young person to stop following a religion.*

In Hillview Primary School, we promote the values of Fairness, Honest and Kindness. We do not agree with bullying and believe that everyone has the right to feel safe and happy in school.

What is bullying?

Bullying is when someone is either verbally or physically threatened or hurt by another child or group of children repeatedly.

Roles and Responsibilities of Pupils

- If you are being bullied, speak to an adult you can trust and tell them how you feel
- Tell an adult if you know someone is being bullied
- Follow the school rules: Be Determined, Be Safe and Be Respectful
- Put any worries you have into the worry box or monster
- Use the buddy bench
- Speak to your friends and look after each other

Roles and Responsibilities of staff

- Listen to all pupils

- Develop everyone's understanding of what bullying is
- Organise a yearly anti-bullying week
- Follow the flow chart outlined below
