This is a creative competition, use your imagination and be as creative as you can.

This year's **theme** for the Competition is 'Euro 2020'.

Scotland is a vibrant country with a past made up of people from all over the world. We have a truly rich heritage. We want to get the message out to the rest of Europe that we are a country that celebrates diversity and values individuals no matter their backgrounds. Influences from all over the world have created the Scotland we live in today.



It is **not** mandatory to follow this theme. We can't wait to see your creative efforts to challenge racism and celebrate diversity.

Show Racism the Red Card have a range of educational packs and films covering anti-racism, Islamophobia, racism towards asylum seekers and refugees, and sectarianism.

1. Entry to the competition is **free** and open to learners resident in Scotland and attending any Scottish school or FE college.
2. Entries may come from individuals or groups and must be submitted by the school/college the entrant(s) attends.
3. All work submitted should be original and specifically produced for the competition but may include school/college curriculum work.
4. Please ensure all works produced are capable of being physically submitted for judging. The cost of submitting entries is the responsibility of the centre. Please see below for guidelines:

**Art:** One sheet no larger than A1 on paper, card or canvas. Unmounted or unframed. Entries may be in any two-dimensional medium including watercolour, pencil, oil, charcoal, crayon, acrylic, mixed medium or original paint (lithograph, monoprint, screen-print, etching, etc) and may include elements of collage, photography or digitally manipulated imagery.

**Creative writing/short story:** No more than 900 words. Please include title. Must be typed or printed. Where other language is used, an English translation should also be submitted.

**Poetry:** No more than 60 lines. Where other language is used, an English translation should also be submitted. Must be typed or printed.

**Film/Multimedia:** No more than 7 minutes running time.

**Music:** No more than 4 minutes. Compositions must be original and not infringe copyright of existing published materials. Radio 'jingles' should be one minute maximum.

**Dance/Drama:** Dance pieces should be submitted by video. Drama scripts should be a maximum five minutes in length. A recording of the production to accompany the script would be welcome.

**Research Project:** 600 words maximum including attachments. This can be presented in any medium.

5. Judging will take place during February 2020. Finalists will be notified at the start of March with the overall category winner being announced at the awards ceremony in Hampden Park, Glasgow. The judging panel will include subject experts appointed by Show Racism the Red Card.
6. Prizes awarded by SRtRC have no monetary equivalent.
7. All works submitted will be retained by Show Racism the Red Card. We reserve the right to reproduce all works in printed and digital media for promotional and educational purposes.
