

# Reading Challenges

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Book Review</u></p> <p>Write a book review for your favourite book. Make sure you include the title and author, a summary of the plot and your opinion about the book. Make sure you give lots of detail to explain why you either liked or did not like the book. Use lots of high quality adjectives (not just “good” or “bad”).</p> <p>Challenge: Make a poster to advertise your book.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Character Sketch</u></p> <p>Pick a character in the book you are currently reading. Find and write down any evidence in your book that tells you what this character looks like. Once you have done this draw a picture of what you think the character would look like. If you cannot find any evidence telling you what the character looks like, then pick a different character.</p> <p>Challenge: can you do the same for the other characters in the story?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Comic Book Strip</u></p> <p>Pick a chapter from your favourite book and recreate it as a comic strip. Make sure your comic strip has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Clear, colourful pictures</li> <li>• A short one sentence caption for each box</li> <li>• Speech bubbles (if needed) for the characters</li> <li>• Correct sequence of events- as told in the book/chapter</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Setting</u></p> <p>Describe the setting in your book. Where and when does the story take place? Does the setting change throughout the story? Why is this setting important?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>5 Elements of a Story</u></p> <p>Describe the elements of the story you are currently reading. The five elements are:</p> <p>Plot, Characters, Setting, Conflict/Problem, Theme.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Meet Up</u></p> <p>Imagine that characters from two different books you have read meet up (one character from each book). Write a brief description of what you think would happen. Where would they go and what would they do? Why do you think this? What would they talk about? Do you think they would get along?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Make a Recommendation</u></p> <p>A great way to find a new book to read is to get recommendations from other people. Who else might like a book that you have recently read? Write this person a letter explaining why you think they would like this book.</p> <p>Challenge: Write a new blurb for your book.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Book Besties</u></p> <p>What do you think about the main character in the book you are currently reading? Would you like to be friends with them in real life? Why or why not? Find 3 examples from the book which can help you to explain why you would or would not like to be friends with this character. Remember to use quotation marks “ ” when giving your examples from the book.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Predict the Future</u></p> <p>How do you think the book you are currently reading will end? What do you think will happen to the characters? Will they resolve their problem or situation? Write a brief explanation of what you think will happen and why. Draw a picture to go with it.</p>

Draw a picture and write about your favourite part.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Quiz</u></p> <p>Make a true or false quiz based on your story.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Book cover</u></p> <p>Design a new cover for your book.</p>
