

<p>Spelling</p> <p>Adding my spelling words. Vowels are worth 10 and consonants are 5. Write your words and then add the value of each letter in the word. e.g. cat $5 + 10 + 5 = 20$</p>	<p>Spelling</p> <p>Use an old newspaper or magazine (ask permission first). Find and cut up the letters that make up your spelling words and glue them into your homework jotter.</p>	<p>Spelling</p> <p><u>Rainbow writing</u></p> <p>Write out your spelling words using a different colour for each letter.</p>	<p>Spelling</p> <p><u>Pyramid Writing</u></p> <p>Write each of your words like a pyramid.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">s so som some</p>	<p>Spelling</p> <p>Write your spelling words using fancy letters. Write the word normally, then write it in a fancy way. e.g. statue</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>statue</i></p>
<p>Maths</p> <p>Roll a die and multiply the number that appears by your focus times table. E.g. practise your x2, so roll a 3 and times it by 2.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>Number bonds to 10 -speedy!</p> <p>Ask a family member to say a number 0-10, you must answer as fast as you can the number that you need to add to it to make 10.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>Doubles</p> <p>Roll a dice, whatever number it lands on, double it as fast as you can.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>Near doubles</p> <p>Learn this type of calculation off by heart by doubling then adding on, ask an adult to test you. E.g. $6+7$, $8+9$, $3+4$</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p><u>Alphabet Numbers</u></p> <p>If the letters a=1, b=2, c=3 and so on, how much do the letters in your whole name add to (first name, middle and surname)?</p>
<p>George's Marvellous Medicine</p> <p>George lives on a farm. If you can, try to visit a farm. One of our nearest ones is the Museum of Rural Life in East Kilbride. Do they have the same animals that George has on his farm?</p>	<p>George's Marvellous Medicine</p> <p>George's dad wants to make the medicine a best seller. Can you design a poster to advertise George's medicine?</p>	<p>George's Marvellous Medicine</p> <p>With an adult at home or at the supermarket look at some children's medicine boxes and bottles. Discuss What type of information is on them. Can you create a mind map of what you found?</p>	<p>George's Marvellous Medicine</p> <p>Can you design and/or create a lab for George to make his medicine? You could draw, paint, build with junk or lego or even create a shoebox scene, be as creative as you like!</p>	<p>George's Marvellous Medicine</p> <p>George and his dad had to weigh out all the ingredients for his medicine. Could you weigh out some ingredients to make a tasty treat? Bake a cake with an adult's help!</p>

Practise by looking at each number and saying the table aloud, i.e. 12 is 2×6.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p><u>Online game</u></p> <p>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>Write out all the multiples of the 5 times table onto sticky notes. Practise by looking at each number and saying the table aloud, i.e. 25 is 5×5.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>Write out all the multiples of the 10 times table onto sticky notes. Practise by looking at each number and saying the table aloud, i.e. 90 is 9×10.</p>
