See how many times you can write your words neatly in that time.</p>	<p>Spelling</p> <p>Spell your words while trying to make the shapes of the letters with your body!</p>	<p>Spelling</p> <p>Trace one of your spelling words on someone's back. Can they guess what word you have written?</p>	<p>Spelling</p> <p>Try to think of some words that rhyme with your spelling words.</p>
