

<u>Alphabetical Order</u> Write all of your spelling words in alphabetical order. (ABC)	<u>Ambidextrous</u> Write all of your spelling words using both your left and right hand.	<u>Backwards Writing</u> Write your spelling words forwards and then backwards. (e.g. dance ecnad)	<u>Bubble Writing</u> Write your spelling words in bubble writing.	<u>Calligraphy</u> Write your spelling words using your fanciest handwriting.	<u>Chalk Writing</u> Use some chalk to write your spelling words outside.
. <u>Dictionary Flashcards</u> Make flashcards using your spelling words - the word on one side and its meaning on the other.	<u>Dot Writing</u> Write your spelling words using dots.	<u>Garden Spelling</u> Use things you find in your garden/local park like sticks and stones to spell your words.	<u>Hidden Words</u> Draw and colour a picture – try to hide as many of your spelling words as you can inside it.	<u>Magazine Spelling</u> Cut out the letters you need from an old magazine and use them to make your spelling words.	<u>Make Your Own</u> Create your own activity to help learn your new spelling words.
<u>Pasta</u> Use pasta to make your different spelling words.	<u>Picture</u> Draw a picture of each of your spelling words to show what each one means.	<u>Playdough</u> Use playdough to make the letters of your spelling words, you could even try making your own playdough!	Rainbow Writing Write your spelling words with coloured pencils, a different colour for each letter.	<u>Sand/Foam Writing</u> Get some sand or foam and try writing your spelling words in it.	<u>Silly Sentences</u> Write silly sentences, including your spelling words.
<u>Singing</u> Sing your spelling words one letter at a time.	<u>Story Writing</u> Write a story using all of your spelling words.	<u>Torch Writing</u> Find a dark room, and use a torch to practice writing your spelling words on the wall.	<u>Typing</u> Use different fonts to type out your spelling words on a computer or tablet.	<u>UPPER and lower</u> Try writing your spelling words in upper case and then lower case.	<u>Word Search</u> Create your own word search using your spelling words.
