Dear Parents/ Carers

We are almost at the end of the last week of remote learning for nearly all of our children and a collective sigh of relief can be heard across the community! I don't want to tempt fate, but I will risk a cautious well done to everyone who has supported our children so ably over this period and has survived to tell the tale.

As I was sitting on a lengthy Teams meeting this morning, I could hear a lovely buzz of chatter and excitement as some of our children went about their learning in our atrium area. Schools are meant to be filled with children and they can seem like very strange places when they feel empty. We cannot wait to see our P4-7s again and let them add to that buzz.

From Monday, our nursery class children will continue to enter the building as usual through our main entrance, lining up to the right-hand side of our Plaza area.

All P1-7 children will also follow their usual routine of entering our playground through the MUGA gate. The school bus also continues to run as normal.

Children who will be attending in-person for the first time may also follow this routine or may wish to wait until 9.20am and enter by buzzing in at the front entrance. A member of staff will then be able to escort them to their new class.

However, at the end of the day our P5-7 pupils will be released from a (never-before-used) gate on the far side of the playground at the far end of the basketball court. They will then be able to use the footpath there either to set home independently or to walk around the perimeter of the MUGA to meet parents/ carers/ siblings at a pre-arranged point on the boulevard. If applicable, please chat in advance to your P5-7 child about where you would like them to meet you. I appreciate this may cause some minor inconvenience but most importantly, will prevent too many bodies congregating in the MUGA making social distancing for adults potentially difficult. P1-4 children will continue to be released through the MUGA as usual.

In addition, for the next 3 weeks, children in P4-7 will have a slightly later morning interval from 10.50-11.05. This will allow us to create more space in our playground for the children. Please note that morning interval tuck is not currently running.

We will review these relatively minor changes to routine on a regular basis and I will get in touch if we feel any further changes may be required.

Nursery Pick Up- Extended Allocation

Thank you to all nursery parents for continuing to wear facemasks during drop-off and collection.

You will appreciate that this can make it more challenging for our staff to always recognise mums, dads, grandparents, aunties, uncles, childminders etc. (and even more so in weather that makes it necessary to

wear big coats and keep your hood up!) . This is particularly so when children have an extended 8-6 provision and are being picked up at different times on different days.
