Our remembrance Service of Light for pupils, parents, friends and staff will be held on Thursday 15th November at 12.25 p.m. in the school Oratory.

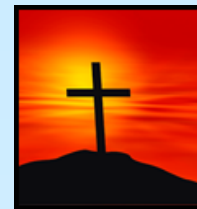
During November, Holy Mass is celebrated at 8.25am in the Oratory on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. All are most welcome.

The Month of the Holy Souls

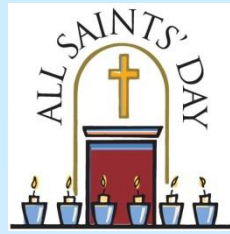
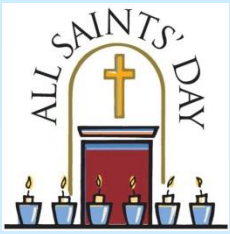

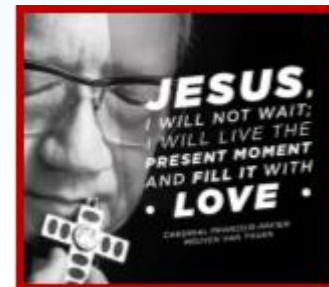
Solemnity of All Saints on being a Saint

Armistance Day



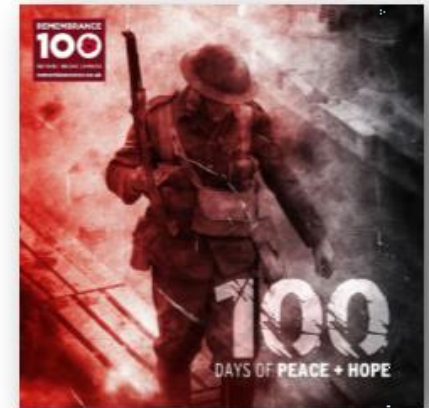
Armistice Day is the 11th November (the day on which the armistice was signed to end the First World War - at 11.00am on the 11th day of the eleventh month).

Remembrance Sunday is the Sunday nearest to Armistice Day and is the national day of remembrance in the UK. Schools mark remembrance of the war dead on a suitable day around this time.

In recent years, the custom of stopping for the 2-minutes silence at 11.00am on 11th November has grown enormously and is widely practiced in public places. You may wish to use the resource during prayers on Thursday or Friday.

As the world commemorates the centenary of the end of the First World War, you may wish to use these visuals with your own two minute silence to commemorate the millions of lives lost during WW1.

Armistice Day



For many years, the contributions of African and Caribbean servicemen to the First World War has been largely forgotten and underexplored. The war's centenary (2014-2019) has presented the opportunity to revisit this history, and to re-examine and rediscover African and Caribbean involvement. It is now recognised that the assistance and service of over 2 million Africans and 16,000 Caribbeans, not to mention the countless Black Britons that joined British regiments, made a considerable and significant impact in terms of manpower and resources.

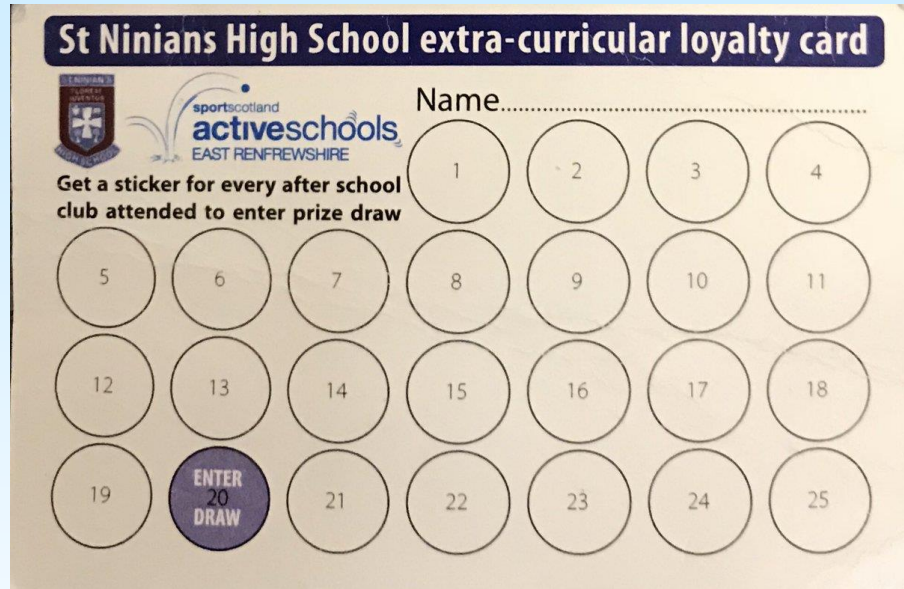

New Loyalty Card
