





















CELEBRATING SUCCESS

Ramadan

- Ramadan, the holiest month in the Islamic calendar, will begin this Sunday 5th May, with the festival of Eid-al-Fitr being celebrated on or around Tuesday 4th June.
- Ramadan is a time for fasting, spiritual reflection, prayer, doing good deeds and spending time with family and friends. The fasting is intended to help teach Muslims self-discipline, self-restraint and generosity. It also reminds them of the suffering of the poor, who may rarely get to eat well.

- In St. Ninian's we support the pupils' observance by providing a rest/prayer room for pupils, one for boys (Maths 1) and another for girls (Maths 2).
- We have selected these rooms as this side of our building faces Mecca, and the rooms will be available during our lunch break.
- Pupils are aware that by nominating these room for their use we are providing them with the opportunity for spiritual contemplation, and that their conduct within the rooms should be reflective of the spirit in which this space is provided.



Respect for All


At St Ninian's we believe it is important to treat everyone with respect. We believe everyone is made in the image of God and we should value everyone.

- being pregnant or having a child




We all have a moral responsibility to ensure that everyone feels they are welcome and that no one is discriminated against for any reason.
