SPOTLIGHT ON FAMILY FOCUS

Staff, pupils and parents have been hard at work this year on activities to achieve the Family Focused Gold Award. This award is given to schools and nurseries who champion equity, equality and diversity and facilitate family involvement in the life and work of the school. Gaining this prestigious award would be great for our school as it's very rarely awarded in East Renfrewshire.

A joint parent and staff body, the Everyone Matters Group, have devised a plan to work towards the award. This includes ensuring that all families are given the opportunity

to be engaged in the life and work of the school and nursery. To support this the group have created a Charter which reinforces the values and ethos of Netherlee. A key part of the evaluation process is feedback from parents in the form of a questionnaire.

We must hit an 80% response rate to be considered for the award so please complete the survey by 12th May.

HEAD TEACHER REPORT



I am pleased to say that Diversity month was a great success, highlighted by our fantastic Diversity evening. This was the first event of this kind in our school and the engagement and support from families was beyond expectation.

Thank you to all involved. We also held a really insightful whole school assembly where our children shared their personal experiences of celebrating religious festivals such as Eid. Going forward our focus will be on diversity in the broadest sense - seeking to celebrate all our differences.

This term is set to be even busier with the show, class trips, sports week and a host of **transition activities** to prepare children for the next stage of their learning. **Primary 7** transition to high school is already well underway. The recent Williamwood High School (WHS) cluster sports festival gave our pupils the opportunity to join in sports and games with children from the other feeder schools. Extended transitions for those requiring additional support have already commenced. WHS staff have been visiting our P7 classes throughout the year. Further transition support will include a video tour, introduction to the WHS pastoral team, talks with former pupils, a maths extravaganza and 2 full induction days in June. A P7 parents information evening is also scheduled for mid June.

New **Primary 1** welcome days are also being arranged for families with those nursery children moving up having classroom visits. The **Nursery** will also hold welcome days for parents and carers to help new starts ease in. More information on all of these sessions will be forthcoming.

Lastly, in the spirit of inclusion and equity we have been thinking about how to improve our **Sports Week** this year (30/5 – 2/6). We will retain some of the traditional competitive races but increase the options to involve more pupils. We hope to balance this with more noncompetitive and widely engaging events involving families such as dance and fitness, sports taster sessions, workshops and possibly inspirational talks.
