

## PI Phonics Homework



In the table below, you will find a list of suggested activities which you can do at home to help your child revise each of the Jolly Phonics sounds taught.

Encourage them to pick at least two activities a week to build upon, and reinforce their learning in class. You can choose to practise the sound learned that day or to revise previous sounds.

Paint with water onto dry slabs/pavement.	Think of five words starting with the sound.	Paint/draw a picture and hide the letter sound you have learned inside of it.	See how many things you can find in the room that starts with the sound.
Type the sound.	Get a newspaper/magazine and highlight the sound every time you see it.	Form letters outside with sticks and leaves. or Draw in mud with stick.	Trace the letter sound on someone's back. Can they guess what it is? You have a turn of guessing too!
Make the letter with playdough. or Use chalk to write the sound outside.	Go on a sound hunt. Look for things inside or outside which begin with the sound – take a photo of what you've found or bring them into class.	Write the letter sound in flour or salt.	Be a sound detective with a magnifying glass. How many of your sounds can you find? (Look on food packages, books, TV etc.)
Play I Spy. How many things beginning with your sound can you find?	How many foods, animals or people's names can you think of beginning with your sound?	Draw as many things as you can that begins with the sound.	Create a shopping list with something beginning with each sound you've learned so far.
Do some rainbow writing. Use lots of different colours to practise your letter formation.	Free choice – you choose what to do!	Use shaving foam to write the letter sounds you've learned so far.	Play I hear with my little ear, something beginning with the sound. How many words can you think of?
