

Worship: Prayer




Take time to pray for others – that they may respond generously to God's calling for them.

Weekly Reflection: Saint of the week: 25th April St Mark





Let us begin: 'In the name of the Father...

St Mark (25th April)

- Much of what we know about St. Mark, the author of the Second Gospel, comes largely from the New Testament and early Christian traditions.
- Mark the Evangelist is believed to be the 'John Mark' referred to in the Acts of the Apostles, the history of the early Church found in the New Testament.
- He was the son of Mary of Jerusalem (Acts 12:12) whose home became a meeting place for the apostles. He is also the cousin of St. Barnabas (Colossians 4:10).
- Mark joined St. Paul and St. Barnabas on their first missionary journey to Antioch in 44 A.D.
- St. Mark's symbol is a winged lion. This is believed to be derived from his description of St. John the Baptist, as "a voice of one crying out in the desert" (Mark 1:3). The wings come from Ezekiel's vision of four winged creatures as the evangelists.
- He is often depicted as writing or holding his Gospel. He is sometimes shown as a bishop on a throne or as a man helping Venetian sailors.
- St. Mark is the patron saint of Venice where his remains are believed to be kept. His feast day is celebrated on April 25.

Day 5: 23rd April is the feast day of St George The Patron Saint of England





St George

Much of what we know about St George is based on legend. Nevertheless over time he became a figure associated with the virtues of Courage and Faith.

One tradition is that George (275/285-303) was born into a Greek Christian noble family in Cappadocia (Today's Turkey) and died in Lydda, then Palestine. At the age of 14, his father died and a few years later his mother.

George followed his father's footsteps, becoming a soldier to Roman Emperor Diocletian. By his late 20's, he had been promoted to the rank of Tribunus (Senior Officer). However, in 302, Diocletian issued orders instructing the removal of all Christian soldiers from his army and all other soldiers to worship and offer sacrifice to Roman Gods.

George loudly objected to the order and steadfastly refused every bribe from Diocletian, who previously held George and his father in very high esteem. Finally, Diocletian concluded that he had no choice but to execute George for his "insubordination".

St George's Feast Day is 23rd April, the day of his martyrdom. He is claimed as the Patron Saint of numerous countries, including England and Georgia, as well as of professions and sufferers of diseases.
