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Here are some examples of topics we have recently discussed, and items identified for future meetings:

- **Social Justice Framework and Strategy in Education in East Renfrewshire**  
East Renfrewshire Council are in the process of reviewing the current strategy. The parent council wrote to the Council asking that the place and role of catholic schools in our community be explicitly stated and that the Charter for Catholic Schools in Scotland on social teaching required to be formally recognised in both the Framework and Strategy.

The Council replied positively to our letter and included a commitment to include the Charter for Catholic Schools within the Framework document.

- **Eastwood Park Leisure Development**  
You will be aware that works have started on the new leisure centre and theatre in Eastwood Park. This is being built adjacent to the current facility. Good progress seems to be being made and there have been no particular issues arising from the construction for our school. Once completed, it should be a great community resource.

- **Children (withdrawal from religious education and amendment of UNCRC compatibility duty) Scotland Bill**  
This Bill proposes changes to the process for withdrawing pupils from religious instruction or religious observance at school. The Bill is currently at stage 3 in the Scottish Parliament. The parent council will be keeping a keen eye on this Government backed Bill prior to the Dissolution of Parliament before the Scottish Parliament elections being held on 7 May.

- **Catholic Education**

- **Young People Destinations**  
No, not holiday destinations.... young people's destinations once they leave school. The school tracks this for up to year after leaving school. We recently heard more about this and the outcomes for young people whether that be further study or training, work, college or university. The presentation told us that St Ninian's is consistently above the Council and national average when it comes to positive destinations. This is reflected in the wide range of curriculum options open to our young people and the support work provided by St Ninian's both prior to and after leaving school.
