SAY NO TO RACISM

- The Race Relations (Amendment) Act 2000 places a statutory duty on our school to raise awareness about the Act.
- Racism is a belief that people of one race or racial origin are superior to people from other.
- Racism is any form of hostile or offensive action against individuals or groups which is related to skin colour, ethnic origin, cultural background or nationality.
- Such behaviour can severely affect a pupil's ability to learn effectively and the effect of harassment can remain with a person throughout their life.
- Through the Gospel Values that permeate the life of our school we aim to foster in our pupils attitudes which afford respect and worth to all, irrespective of creed, colour or social background, and to respect the uniqueness of every human being.
- Our aim is to enable all pupils to be morally sensitive and free of prejudice, growing and developing in an atmosphere of tolerance & understanding of others, remembering that whatever our skin colour, ethnicity, or culture, we are all children of the one God
