

There will be a series of four reflection sessions for all staff on the Tuesdays in Advent. They will run between 4:00pm and 4:30pm in the Oratory, led by staff.








Eucharistic Adoration


Venerable Margaret Sinclair Novena

We would also invite anyone who cannot manage to our Oratory at this time to join with us in prayer.






The Rosary

- There are many dangers to social media
 - Cyberbullying, sexting and online predators to name a few

- Our Campus Police Officer works closely with the school and the Cyber Crime unit – these matters are taken very seriously






Our School and Community

- No mobile phones used or they will be confiscated







Be Organised


- Keep pencil case full

- Always complete your homework








