You will be aware that the UK and Scottish Government have made the decision to now close schools in response to the rise in positive cases and the increasing spread of the new strain of Covid – 19 (Coronavirus).

St Clare's Primary School staff have discussed contingency plans and are currently preparing for online learning to begin for your child from **Monday 11**th **January 2021.** Since August we have experienced a successful six months together in school and understandably this situation is difficult but necessary to continue to keep everyone safe.
