

National 5 Course Outline

At Williamwood High School, the art and design department presents an average of 100 National 5 candidates every year. This is the highest presentation in Scotland. Subsequently over three quarters of these pupils go on to take Higher, again the largest presentation in Scotland.

National 4 and 5 is a common course and provides learners with a broad, practical experience of art and design skills and related Art and Design Studies.

The National 5 course is worth 200 marks and is divided into two components; expressive/design course and art and design studies.

These two components are made up of unit work and course work. Unit work is internally assessed and verified. The course work comprises of a portfolio which is externally assessed by SQA (a combined 73% of total mark). The expressive and design folios are worth 80 marks each. The Art and Design studies is a one hour and ten minutes written examination worth 40 marks.

Expressive Portfolio

The portfolio is worth 80 marks (36% of total). This area of the course enables learners to plan, develop, produce and present art work which demonstrates creativity and the application of practical skills. Through further development of observational drawing and painting skills learners will explore methods to visually represent the world they live in and communicate their thoughts, ideas and opinions.

This portfolio of work will be presented through the production of an A1 sheet which is submitted to SQA for external assessment. In the portfolio, learners will produce a variety of small compositional studies and one A2 expressive art-work. An evaluation worth 8 marks is completed using an official pro-forma. National 4 candidates are not required to submit a portfolio of work to SQA.









Design Portfolio

The portfolio is worth 80 marks (36% of total). The design component teaches learners to plan and write a design brief, carry out market research and develop creative design work in response to the brief. Using the design elements learners will develop their creativity, problem solving and critical thinking skills to resolve design issues and constraints. They will develop a critical understanding of designers' working practices and the main social and cultural influences affecting their work. The portfolio of work will be presented through the production of an A1 sheet. Through further development, students will produce a variety of design drawings, material samples and models. A final design resolution is produced and photographed. An evaluation proforma is worth 8 marks.







Art and Design Studies

National 4 candidates are not required to submit a portfolio of work to SQA.

This component is worth 40 marks (20% of total). The learner will draw on, extend and apply the skills they have learned during the production of unit work. The question paper assesses the application of knowledge and skills and is in the format of a traditional exam which lasts one hour and ten minutes. There is no exam for National 4.

Celebrating Success: Exhibitions

Every year we celebrate the success of all of our National and Higher candidates by exhibiting their work in 'The Street' area of the school.

This is a very popular event which is open to all candidates, their friends, family and to members of the public. At this event, calendars showing selected students work are available as well as framed prints of all candidates' expressive work.
