I Am Active

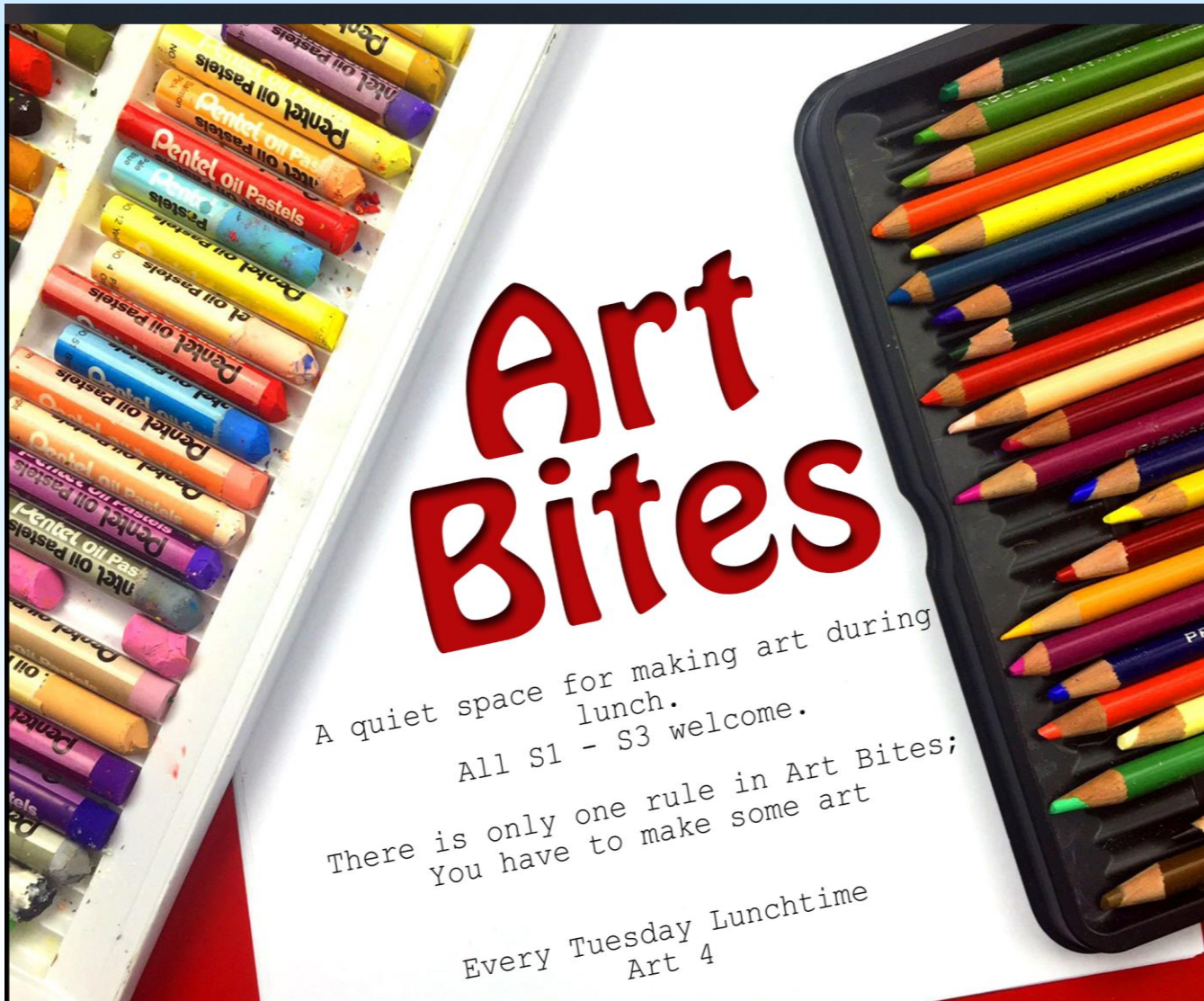
Being active means
