We started term 3 with five new children, bringing our total to 28. They have all settled in fairly quickly. Missing from the picture on the right is Alfie Martin.

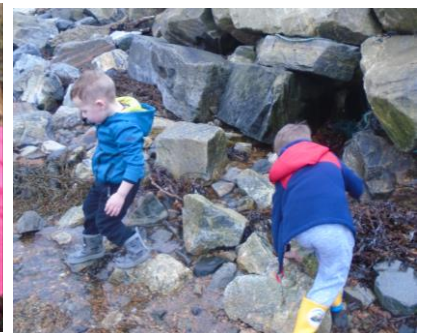


Term 3 - Topic Work

Our first topic was Fine and Gross Motor Skills, the children participated in different activities indoor and outdoor to help strengthen their fine and gross motor skills. They had a great time playing in the snow, using spades to move snow from one place to another and their bodies to make shapes and mark make in the snow.



We then moved on to the Under the Sea topic as some of the children showed an interest in sea creatures. The children went on learning walks to the shore, and visited the Library for books with information on the sea. They engaged in various activities using different resources to create their own small world sea areas in the room and outdoors. They also created their own artwork which is displayed on the walls around the room.



Transition

After trialling different weekly transition models for preschool children to P1GM and P1 EM it was decided that after the three-week trial that 2 mornings a week (Monday and Tuesday) was the most effective for the children. The children are enjoying going to the primary and have adapted well to the new routine.

For Chinese New Year the children had noodles for snack and made and decorated lanterns.

Term 4 Topic

This term our topic was Our Senses. The children learnt about their different senses by exploring the environment indoors and outdoors, looking at what we can see, what things looked like - their shape, colour, size and amount. We listened to different sounds indoor and outdoor and talked about the different textures of objects indoor and



The children also explored different scents to guess what the smells were and they tasted a range of different foods at snack. (Sweet, salty, sour). Our Story was Goldilocks where the children were taught about what we should and shouldn't do and how we keep ourselves safe outdoors. From our story the children took an interest in teddy bears. To finish off our topic we went on a Teddy Bears' picnic in the school grounds where again the children tasted different foods.





RAF DAY
The children participated in the Developing the Young Workforce RAF day and listened to the pilots talking about their work and they got to try on uniforms and helmets, and got their photos taken. They really enjoyed this and some of them talked about wanting to be pilots for days afterwards.
