

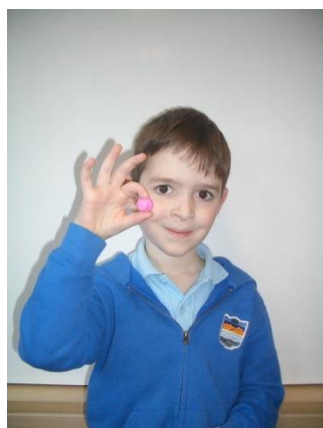
## Primary 1-4 Class:

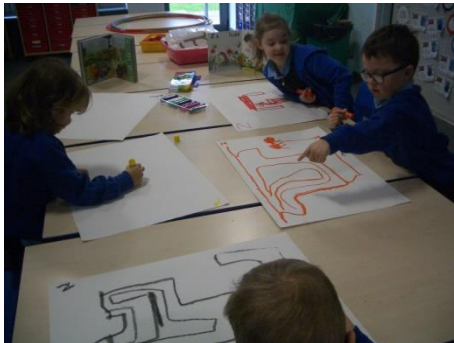
### The Weaving Wheel:

Margaret and Benji are working on the relationship between addition and subtraction – while Riley has been busy making friends of ten.



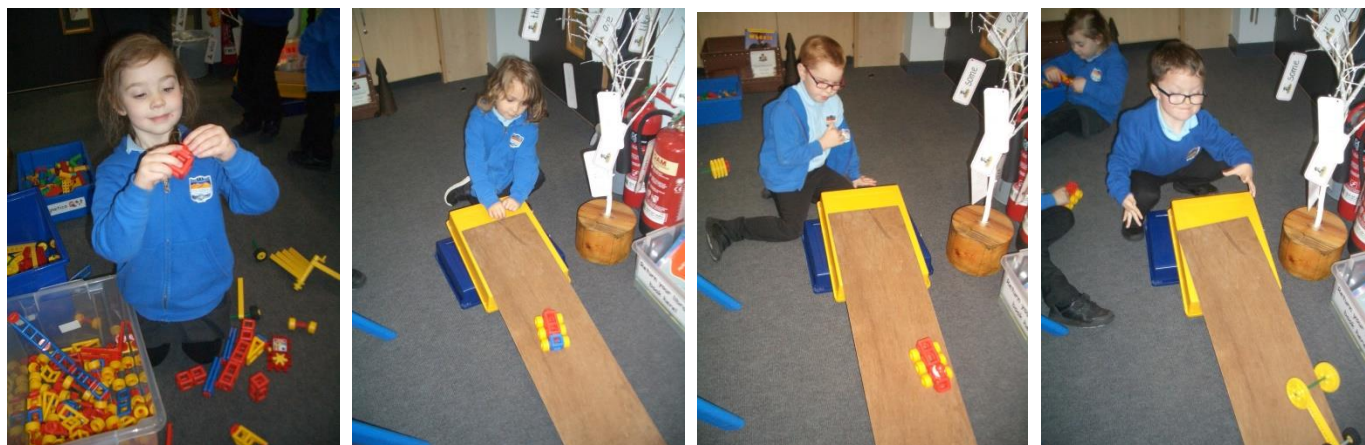
### Mrs. Armitage on Wheels:

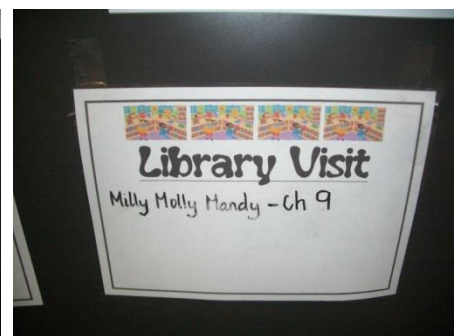
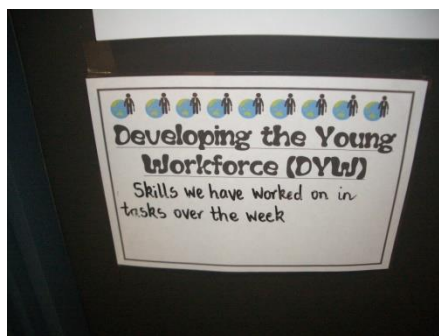
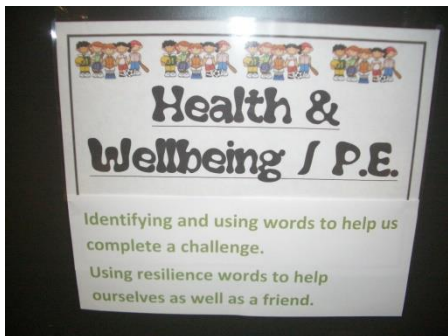
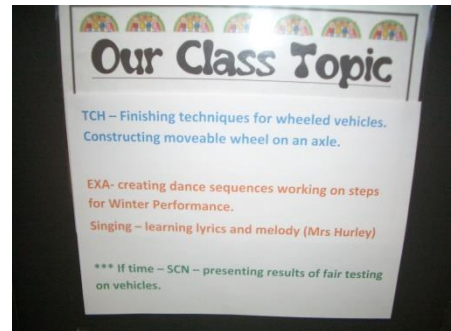
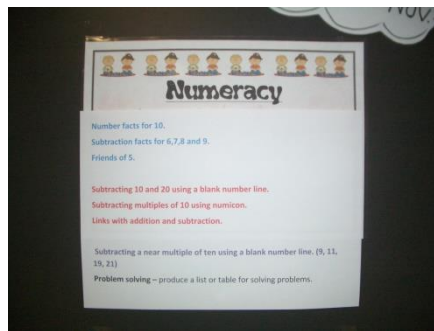
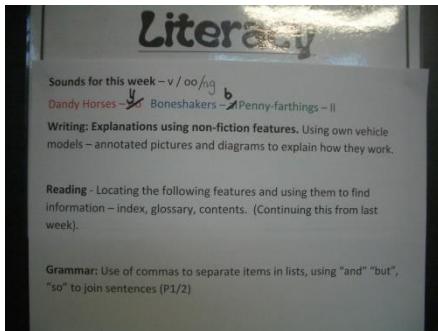
## Evaluating this week's Learning:
