Visit to The Distillery



The children were given pumpkins from the distillery to design and carve so they could be displayed there. We talked about the shape and weight of the pumpkins and the children measured them using different measuring tools, i.e. rulers, cubes, string and measuring tapes. They then sorted the pumpkins from the smallest to the biggest. After that the children designed their pumpkins on paper and the children voted who their favourite design was, which was Jamie's. We carved the pumpkins using different shapes for each



one, squares, circles, triangles and rectangles and the last one was carved to Jamie's design. We kept the seeds and cooked them to have as part of our snack. 

MENTORS IN VIOLENCE PREVENTION

Mentors in Violence Prevention is a peer mentoring programme that gives young people an opportunity to explore and challenge the attitudes, beliefs and cultural norms that underpin gender-based violence, bullying and other forms of violence. MVP is a relatively new programme to Sir E Scott, having only been run once before in 2019 by last year's S6 group who delivered it very successfully to the S4s at the time. Next term, MVP will be delivered once again by a group of S6 pupils – Scott Murray, David Golish, Sarah Helfrich and Emma Passmore. The group completed two full days of MVP training in October with the help of Mr Johnson and Isabel Steele to prepare them for delivery of the programme.

MVP addresses a range of behaviours including name-calling, sexting, controlling behaviour and harassment, and uses a 'by-stander' approach where individuals are looked on as active bystanders with the ability to challenge violent behaviour of their peers in a safe way. The aim of the programme is to educate young people on how to positively influence the attitudes and behaviour of their peers.

When the programme was first run at SES in 2019, evidence of the impact of MVP was gathered through staff feedback, attitude questionnaires and focus groups, with both the mentors and mentees reporting that they were now more aware of the issues related to violence, gender-based violence and bullying. They also reported being more knowledgeable about their options as a bystander and ways to safely challenge unacceptable behaviour. The programme is also an excellent way for mentors to improve their confidence and enhance a range of skills such as team-work and presentation skills.



At Sir E Scott, our hope with running the MVP programme is not only to educate our peers about violence and ways of challenging behaviour, but also to improve ethos within school and reduce barriers between older and younger pupils. MVP will be delivered to the S3 group at SES after the Christmas break by the S6 MVP mentors who are all very excited by this opportunity! Sarah Helfrich, S6

S1 COP 26 PROJECT

The current S1 worked on a group project during COP26 with the theme —Designing a Community for the Future. Run by Western Isles Libraries in conjunction with Architecture and Design Scotland, the class was thrilled to learn that they had won a School Achievement Award for their work 'Our Vision for a Greener Harris'. To top it off, Rosie Macrae won an individual Certificate of Commendation for her concept of a home on stilts which would rise and fall with the tide as needed.

Every member of the class developed their own ideas to use the natural assets around us to live in a more sustainable way. Ideas ranged from the radical – using communal spaces between homes for utilities like community cars and laundry and food storage / sharing, to the easily achievable, for example only buying meat and seafood produced locally and planting edible only gardens, as well as every kind of renewable energy. The judges have given excellent feedback on each pupil's contribution giving food for thought for the future. Fantastic teamwork everyone!

S2 COP 26 PROJECT

S2 pupils made some great images as a response to the COP 26 conference in November. Imaginative, urgent and a snapshot of how pupils feel at the present time about the climate issue, how it could affect them in future and a call to action for change.









S3 COP26 WORK

At the same time as the COP 26 Climate Conference was taking place in Glasgow, S3 pupils were examining the work of Icelandic art superstar Olafur Eliason. The class studied his very unusual approaches to making art and learned about his Little Sun project which aims to provide small solar lights to developing countries. These help with health, educational and social outcomes for people of all ages, but perhaps for children most of all. ART COURSEWORK




