Primary 1-4 Class:

Maths: Lots of practical work was the order of the day. We began some work on fractions, which always allows plenty of practical tasks – as well as some recording. We made models using our knowledge of "half" and "quarter". One half had to be one colour and one half had to be another – otherwise it is not fair or equal. Once we have counted out our amounts we could then concentrate on building. We did the same using quarters. Four colours divided equally ensures we are building with quarter amounts.

















We ran into a few tricky problems along the way.... Building with cubes means our models have no curved edges and some of us had to adapt our designs along the way!












Our finished results were really good. The children came up with some great ideas!

We also had a try at sharing Pirate Jack's treasure out equally too... This time it's Uilleam and Mia; Angus and Macie – and Andrew and Finlay George!





Riley, Lydia and Bella are busy making fractions of different amounts.

They are using squared paper to help them calculate!

Next, we worked in pairs towards the end of the week constructing a figure half the size of the measurements given.

The children had to first calculate what half was before measuring their paper accurately in centimetres to ensure correct measurements.

We spent part of Friday turning our figures into individuals!








