It remained rather hot for lots of running about, so we adapted our outdoor time to play a few games that didn't really involve a lot of running around! Make a shape with your partner where your feet are touching...

Next let's make a shape where your hands must touch.... Here's Autumn and Darcey; Macie and Andrew; Angus and Uilleam.







What about a shape where hands and feet touch.... Here's Hannah and Mia; Lydia and Flora and Seth and Cooper!







Let's now make a shape where our backs touch....









This was followed by a class challenge. Pass the cardi around the group without dropping hands! It was quite a challenging task with the children using different parts of their anatomy to try and pass it all the way round the circle.

We got there in the end!















I don't know how you all managed it!

The whole thing gave Mrs. Mackinnon a good laugh anyway....

... As the weather is unprecedented at the moment, we have been spending quite a bit of time outside. It is however, a bit too hot to run around much. We have been doing some paired work with hoops!















Working with a partner to make a circle – it's Autumn and Darcey; twisting the spine to pass the hoop – Flora and Mia; Benji and Cooper. Make the twist bigger by turning the opposite way – Uilleam and Angus. Overhead passing – Finlay George and Andrew; Elsie and Brooke. Next it was passing the hoop to a partner using feet only – quite tricky especially when the hoop rolls down the leg! Seth and Riley are giving this one a try – so are Hannah and Lydia. Finally, some tummy muscle work – sitting up with the hoop – Margaret and Grace; Finlay George and Andrew!

Very well-done boys!




### **It's Harris Mod Week!**

Here's Vickie from the gallery talking to the children about all the conceptual art pieces in the exhibition.


We've not seen the travelling gallery for a while so it was fun to see something different!
