
Class Prizes

Members of the highly acclaimed musical group ALT from Sir E Scott School Tarbert, are this year's recipient of the Neil Martin Honour Trophy.

Isla Scott, Ellie-Ceit Johnson and Anna Macleod were presented with the Trophy and certificates at the school's recent Assembly, by Ailish Martin the granddaughter of Rachel Martin, Bunavoneadar.

Formed in the summer of 2022, Alt have accumulated wide-spread acclaim and recognition for their stunning singing voices, musical proficiency, endorsement of the Gaelic language and their representation of Harris on a local, national and international level. Alt has developed from a school ceilidh band to a band providing the girls with the opportunity of using vocals and experimenting with harmonies. In addition to releasing a three-track EP earlier this year the group were selected out of over 400 applicants to participate at the prestigious Celtle Connections concert in Glasgow in January. They now hope to perform at next month's Hebridean Celtic Festival in Stornoway.

Alt were nominated for the award by Iain MacSween, Gaelic Teacher at Sir E. Scott School, who commented: "It's been fascinating to watch the group grow in stature as the weeks and months have gone by. In a very short space of time, Alt have established themselves as an extremely accomplished traditional music group, and especially encouraging is their passion and determination to promote their beloved Gaelic language."

Alt is the third group from Sir E Scott to have received the Trophy. The Award went to the Sòlas Enterprise Group in 2002 with the Beartas Group picking up the Trophy in 2003.

Nominations are now invited for the 2023 Award. Persons up to the age of 25 who have brought credit to themselves or the community and with Harris connections are eligible to be considered. YPI

Sir E Scott School pupils took part in the Youth and Philanthropy Initiative (YPI) again this session (2022-23) as we have for the past ten years or so. YPI is an initiative supported and financed by the Wood Foundation and leads to a local charity winning a £3000 grant to support their work.

Once again, YPI offered our pupils great opportunities to learn about some of the many issues facing people in our community. It allowed them to find out how local charities work to support those facing those issues and to consider how we can contribute to the



important work these charities do.

YPI is undertaken by all pupils in S3 and is delivered through their English class. The work involved gives our students real life contexts in which to develop their literacy skills, grow their confidence, and engage with a wide range of adults and partners within and out-with the school setting.

Pupils work in groups to identify an issue they wish to focus on, establish a link with a charity addressing that issue, and to work with that charity on a business plan for the use of the \pounds 3000 grant they are bidding for.

The initiative culminates in a grand final in which each group gives a presentation describing the work of the charity they are representing, outlining how their charity would use the £3000 grant, and explaining the positive impact that support would have on those the charity supports.

This year the charities being represented were: Action for Children; Advocacy Western Isles; Alzheimer Scotland Western Isles; Befriending Lewis and Harris; Eilean Siar Foodbank; and Western Isles Cancer Care Initiative.

Well done to the winning group and indeed to all the groups who gave presentations in their bids to win the grant for their chosen charity. The presentations were informative, persuasive, creative, moving and entertaining. The hard work and commitment that had gone into the project was clear to see and our pupils were able to show their abilities as communicators and as responsible citizens and effective contributors to their communities.

The winners of the final were the group – Alex Passmore, Bella Maclean, Katie Rose Macleod and Seoras Macdonald -- representing Alzheimer Scotland. Alzheimer Scotland will receive a cheque for £3000 to spend on developing their online resources for those living with Alzheimer's and on extending their "Musical Memories" sessions in Lewis and Harris.

The rival groups also came together to put on a fundraising event. A coffee and home-baking morning in Taigh Mo Shennair at the Harris Hotel raised over £700, smashing their target of £250. The pupils led and organised this event largely by themselves and did it very impressively. Well done to all involved. We look forward to another round of YPI next session when we will learn more about the social issues facing our communities and the work of local charities, and hear the stories of those facing and tackling these issues.

ICELAND TRIP

Senior pupils from Sir E Scott arrived back from a spectacular trip to Iceland on the last day of term. The pupils enjoyed visits to some of Iceland's most well known volcanic and glacial landscapes including lava flows from recent eruptions, hot springs, hot rivers, massive waterfalls and glaciers. They took a boat trip amongst icebergs in glacier lagoon and bathed in thermal baths before finishing with a trip to Thingvellir and the continental divide and some time in Iceland's capital city, Reykjavik.













REMOTE 3

For the last 6 months, a group of S3/S4s (Alex Passmore, Bella Maclean, Bethany Macleod, Calum Macleod, Christopher Eadie and Seamus Mackay) have been taking part in a science outreach project run by the University of Edinburgh called Remote3 (pronounced *Remote cubed*).

The idea behind the project was for the group to design a Lego robot that could be programmed to complete a series of challenges in a harsh environment like that found on Mars. In June the Rionnagan Robot (as the group christened their team) watched on a live stream as Domhnall the robot went 1 km underground to the Boulby research facility where real Mars rovers have previously been tested - and successfully completed all the planned challenges. The scientists running the tests, some of whom have worked on designing robots that have actually visited Mars, commented positively on a number of design features of Domhnall and at the final awards Rionnagan Robot won the prize for Best Robot Design. This was a well-deserved award and the team should be very proud of what they have achieved together.



Who knows, maybe we'll see one or two of them designing robots and rovers for future space missions. 'S math a rinn sibh uile.

Some of students had really strong ideas about what they want to do in the future, with at least two really keen to become Gaelic primary teachers in the future.

For the older students, it was more about



asking questions about potential future jobs, upcoming opportunities, and the processes of applying to the different organisations. Students were also able to speak to Skills Development Scotland regarding potential pathways and UHI Outer Hebrides and the Comhairle's apprenticeship team about the different courses available and what qualifications they would need to be able to access them.


